For 70 years there has been an uninterrupted Air Force mission at Truax Field in Madison, Wisconsin.

From the F-51 Mustangs first assigned to the squadron at its formation in 1948, to becoming the first Air National Guard unit to fly a modern jet fighter with the F-89A Scorpion mission in the 1950s, to the F-102s in the 1960s-70s and the A-10 Thunderbolt in the 1980s.

In 1992, following the unit receiving the first "OUTSTANDING" rating ever given to any fighter unit for a Unit Effectiveness Inspection and numerous other Outstanding Unit Awards, the Fighter Wing began converting to the F-16 Fighting Falcons.

The F-16s currently assigned to the 115th Fighter Wing are the F-16 Block 30 aircraft, the oldest operational F-16s in the Air Force. The F-35 is considered to be the Air Force's replacement for the early model F-16 aircraft, which are expected to be retired in the 2020's.

In April 2016, the Air Force identified 18 Air National Guard bases which operate 4th Generation fighters (F-15, F-16 & A-10) as candidate bases for an F-35 mission. In December 2016, Truax Air National Guard Base was named as one of the 5 candidates which would be further evaluated along with sites in Boise (ID), Selfridge (MI), Jacksonville (FL) and Montgomery (AL).

On December 21st, 2017 the United States Air Force selected Truax Field Air National Guard Base, Wisconsin as one of the preferred location for the next two Air National Guard F-35A bases.

"Selecting Truax Field will increase Air National Guard F-35A units providing 5th Generation airpower around the world," said Secretary of the Air Force

Heather Wilson. "As F-35As arrive at these locations, we will use the existing aircraft at these fields to replace the aging F-16s at other Air National Guard units."

At this time, the Air Force expects the F-35As to begin arriving at Truax Field in early 2023 and at Dannelly Field later that year.

These locations remain preferred alternatives until the secretary of the Air Force makes the final basing decisions after the requisite environmental analysis is complete.

Studies of concluded that the proposed F-35A program are not able to be nuclear equipped, contrary to the opposition which has repeatedly stated and continues to state forth.

The 115th Fighter Wing makes significant contributions to the local and state economy:

- The 115th Fighter Wing employs over 1,200 civilian and military employees and has a payroll of approximately \$62 million
- The 115th Fighter Wing provides Fire and EMS support for Truax
- The 115th Fighter Wing supports 1,650 in-state jobs and has an annual economic impact of over \$100 million
- The 115th Fighter Wing, with the F-35A program will provide on going nad continued employment and growth opportunities, to include upgrading facilities.
- The 115th Fighter Wing provides over \$1 million in annual tuition payments to local colleges helping Airmen return into the private sector workforce with an undergraduate degree, 6 years of on the job training in a diverse array of highly technical career fields

Over the last seven decades, the 115th Fighter Wing has made numerous contributions to our state and region. Receiving the F-35 mission will ensure that these contributions and many more to come, will remain for decades to come.

To the Alders of the City of Madison:

I am a resident on the north side of Madison, and I live very close to the Dane County Regional Airport (DCRA). I have been a member of the Madison community for over 25 years. As a taxpayer in the community, I am very upset that many of you, during this time of the COVID-19 pandemic, are trying to destroy an organization that has been an important part of our community for over 70 years. I want to remind you, in times of State and National contingencies, the men and women of the 115 Fighter Wing, of the Wisconsin Air National Guard, are called upon to support our community, our State, and our Nation.

The 115 Fighter Wing of the Wisconsin Air National Guard is a good neighbor, and whatever lies, and half-truths may have been stated, from opponents of Truax, and future basing of the F-35 in Madison, the members of the 115 Fighter Wing are special citizens who care deeply about our community. The Wisconsin Air National Guard at Truax, its men and women have been part of Madison, and serving our State, since 1948.

The Air National Guard base at Truax is a complete micro-community, of approximately 1,200 employees, both military and civilian, in many career fields, besides pilots. The 115 Fighter Wing employs doctors, dentists, nurses, medical technicians, lawyers, accountants, civil engineers, IT technicians, fire fighters, police, logisticians, vehicle mechanics, cooks, aircraft mechanics, avionics technicians, command and control technicians, public relations specialists, air traffic control specialists, and many other highly trained citizens. Many members of the 115 Fighter Wing are attending college, thanks to outstanding educational benefits—right here in Madison, at the University of Wisconsin.

In the event of natural disasters and national emergencies, members of the 115 Fighter Wing have been called upon to protect us, and provide needed services. Many members of the 115 Fighter Wing have already been called to active duty, to provide needed services in the State of Wisconsin, to combat the COVID-19 pandemic. Many other examples of how the 115 Fighter Wing has directly served the community can be sighted. On September 11, 2001, many members of the 115 Fighter Wing were called to active duty, after our nation was attacked. In September, 2018, members of the 115 Fighter Wing responded to historic flooding, which placed Middleton and other communities west of Madison, under water. In September, 2006, two pilots responded to a potential threat in a commercial airliner, over the City of Chicago. Many more examples of how the 115 Fighter Wings supports Madison, the State of Wisconsin, and our Nation, can be sited.

It is important for all of you to remember that the fire department at DCRA is fully funded by the USAF. The fire department at DCRA is an Air Force requirement for the F-16, and, the fire and rescue services provided by the USAF are also required by FAA regulation, the for large commercial aircraft that serve DCRA. If we lose the future basing for the F-35, the aging F-16C currently based at Truax, will eventually be phased out. When the F-16 is gone, DCRA will lose the USAF-funded fire department, which will have to be replaced and staffed by Dane County, increasing our tax burden.

Basing of the F-35 in Madison will ensure that the 115 Fighter Wing, a major Madison employer, providing excellent wages, benefits, educational opportunities, and retirements, will be around for decades to come. If the 115 Fighter Wing does not secure basing of the F-35, the F-16 will eventually age out, and will not be replaced. As often happens at Air Guard bases without a flying mission, Truax will be closed, and a great employer, and economic engine for our community will be permanently lost.

In the past 20 years, the City of Madison has lost a number of major employers, and the tax base that goes with it. Many of those companies have relocated outside of Madison. Middleton, for example, is now home to a number of companies that used to be based in Madison. Please do not lose another major Madison employer, especially one that provides excellent wages, benefits, educational opportunities, and retirements.

Regarding noise, the Federal Aviation Administration can be called upon to help with noise mitigation, if needed. The 115 Fighter Wing is also concerned about noise, and it does what it can to mitigate it as much as possible. The vast majority of flights for the F-16 takeoff on Runway 36, to the north, and land on Runway 18, to the south, to mitigate noise. That procedure will continue with the F-35. From my own experience, living close to DCRA, the airlines, including FedEx late at night, actually generate more noise, over a longer period of time, than the F-16s ever have. As a newer aircraft, the F-35 is also a more efficient, and fewer are

Greetings,

I am writing in opposition to Resolution 60043, which opposes the F-35 bed down at Truax Field.

I find it appalling that this body would take up a moment of time on the issue of aircraft flying out of Truax Field during a time of national crisis. Our community and our country scrambles at this time to fight off a pandemic which is currently killing our citizens. Yet the council feels compelled to take time to continue to debate the topic of the F-35, rather than work to prepare our community for the social and economic impacts of COVID-19. It is shameful that a few members of the council have chosen to take up ranks with anti-military groups that are clearly the minority in our community. These views are ill informed and dangerous, as are many of the people who espouse to be experts on the subject of military aircraft.

In my previous interactions with some of these members, they have given me no evidence to support their decisions other than newspaper and magazine articles that they have read. The fact is that the final EIS is a worst case scenario document produced for the air force by an independent 3rd party, and is written as such to provide a limit of discourse around what the potential could be, not what it actually will be. The 115th Fighter Wing and the Air Force has spent a tremendous amount of time and effort to clarify this document and debunk the untruths that are being spread by groups opposed to a military presence in Madison.

I am outraged that the council would be seemingly using a time of national emergency to put a resolution on the table concerning the future of over 1,200 members of the 115th fighter wing and their families while over 300 members of our national guard are deployed helping support the fight against COVID-19. All through this debate, people have discussed the impacts of the fighter wing and even the location of the Dane County Regional Airport with only one group of people in mind. What about those 1,200 airmen that are stationed at Truax in either a full time of part time status? What happens to their quality of life and that of their families should Truax close for lack of a mission? Where should we then look for help during times of need like the men and women of the 115th have provided this state and country for over 70 years? After further review of both Tuesday's resolution and the USAF Final EIS statement I am absolutely appalled at the blatant word twisting of the facts in the EIS into your resolution.

Resolution: WHEREAS, the Final EIS released on February 18, 2020, confirms the significant environmental impacts identified in the Draft EIS.

USAF EIS: "Overall, the Proposed Action would be anticipated to result in significant impacts to the airport noise environment, but have no significant impacts in the Special Use Airspace (SUA)"

Resolution: including substantially reduced quality and quantity of current affordable housing stock, decreased value of the property tax base,

USAF EIS: "Construction spending would have short-term <u>benefits</u> for the local economy. Negligible impact on the housing market in the city of Madison. Overall, the potential lost property value would represent between 0.03 and 0.27 percent."

Resolution: reduced opportunities for Transit-Oriented Development, ongoing soil, ground and surface water PFAS contamination violations by the ANG,

USAF EIS: "No significant impacts to surface water, groundwater, and floodplains. Construction activities would have no impact on wetlands." Additionally, PFAS are only mentioned once in the EIS (footnote of page 2-41).

Resolution: significant adverse health effects that disproportionately affect children, residents who are low income and people of color; and,

USAF EIS: "There would be significant disproportionate impacts to low-income and minority populations as well as children." Nowhere, I repeat NOWHERE, does the EIS state there would be "significant adverse health effects." In fact, "adverse health" only appears on page 3-20 (of the 931 pages) and specifically states, "Therefore, HAPs would not create significant or adverse health risks to humans living adjacent to airfields or underneath airspace in which aircraft operate, and are not further evaluated in the analysis."

Again, I find your twisting of words to suit your purpose abhorrent. You should be ashamed of yourselves.

I don't know how many of you lived in Madison/Truax field area from 1956 to 1966 before the Guard took over the Air Force F-102's. During the 56/66 time, I flew as a Radar Intercept Officer (RO) in the back of F-89's. Over that period of time the weapons changed from 20mm canons, to rockets, to a mix of rockets and missiles and finally the Genie missile. I wonder how many people new that this missile was an atomic missile and there were airplanes loaded with this missile on alert at the end of the N-S runway in the alert hangers there. There was also a bunker and shop to store and maintain the missiles that could be placed on other aircraft in time of war.

The F-89 had two engines with afterburners and on takeoff the engines and afterburners were run up before brake release. It might be two or three seconds before brake release so must have been a little noise in the neighborhood. Then the 89 did not climb like the 16 and 35 so another noise factor. I know talking about the past only answers a question about where were complaints back then? Maybe the city council new about the atomic missiles, I don't know but my guess is that they would have raised a stink about it.

While the F-89 is in the past, it points out that things which could be a problem, somehow never materialize. I think the F-98 was a real noise maker because of the way it had to be flown. On a hot high humility day in August, rate of climb was very low, so noise had to be there during take off. Since the rate of climb of the F-35 far exceeds that of 89 I would think it may be less of a problem. Is a little noise for a short time or noise for a longer time more of a problem for the people complaining? While 89's were a while back, the only complaint was Sunday morning so if I we recall, we didn't fly until after lunch on guard drill week ends.

I think for the greater good of this great country of ours, a little noise for a few is a small price in keeping this country as safe as we can make it. I have never heard anyone say anything about the air crew flying the 16 or 35. Perhaps the risk is low, but there is always a risk involved flying these high performance Aircraft. Don't you agree that the pilots and ground crews and maintainers deserve some credit for the safety record the 115 has had

over the time it has been flying out of Dane County Airport? Maybe this is one of the reasons this unit is considered by the Air Force.

Full disclosure -- I am a 30 year vet of the Air Force and Air Guard so maybe I see the big picture different than some.

I am writing today to register my firm opposition to the resolution currently being entertained by the City Council opposing the F-35 Mission at Truax. I find it shameful that our City Council alders and County Government are seeing fit to support something based on misinformation in the first place, and reprehensible that the COVID-19 pandemic is being used to fly this in under the radar.

If anything, the pandemic is proof positive why the unit is so important for us to have here in Madison. The F-35 mission is one facet of the National Guard's role in disaster preparedness and response, and having it here insures that the 115th maintains a high level of support in Wisconsin. Its loss would have network effects that would inevitably impact the rest of their operations. Eroding that is not only a detriment to the local economy, it presents real long-term consequences to our disaster readiness.

The misinformation surrounding the F-35 that is being circulated I find sensational as it is offensive. For being a city that prides itself on its intellectual acumen, I find it baffling that Madisonians seem to so readily glom onto hearsay and biased, partisan sources when it comes to the F-35, and reject credible ones, when the latter finds these jets have comparable impact to the F-16s we currently have, which is to say, not that much at all.

I find it hard to believe that their noise impact, which the unit goes to great pains to try and minimize, is that much worse than the everyday civilian traffic going in and out of Dane County Airport, all day, every day, even during this pandemic. And frankly, as a homeowner on the north side, I am far more encouraged and comforted by the occasional roar of a passing jet vs. the hours of constant droning and industrial noise that comes from nearby heavy industry like the Berntsen Foundry and nearby rail lines. Ultimately, I begrudge none of them the noise, because I understood that in shopping for a home out here, that industrial and airport noise was part of the package. They were here first, and have invested more in this city in terms of job creation and taxes both.

The opponents of the F-35 mission claim its impacts to low-income housing are high, I must then ask, why the city saw fit to locate the low-income housing by the airport in the first place, then? It seems to me that the most equitable solution would be to locate that housing someplace with less ambient noise, and to bulk up our public transportation infrastructure to enable residents of low-income housing to get where they need for work and necessities. This aligns with Mayor Rhodes-Conway's own stated goals for her administration completely. Why is it then necessary to entertain such a divisive and ultimately pointless resolution instead?

Madison is a city with a long and proud military tradition going back to the Civil War. Our fathers, mothers, grandparents, children, friends and neighbors have proudly represented this city within our armed forces for centuries, with great distinction, in every theater they served. I completely and unequivocally support having the F-35s at Truax Field in Madison. Anyone alder who does not should be ashamed. The members of the Air Guard are part of our community and dedicated to selflessly serving their state and nation. How do I know? My dad was at Truax as a fighter pilot from 1958-1989. He was the base commander. He dedicated his life to protecting our state and nation. He coined their motto, "dedicated to excellence". This dedication to absolute excellence continues and anyone who opposes the F-35s has failed to educate themselves and is deliberately ignorant or deeply prejudiced and anti-military.

Truax field and the Dane County airport have been at their location in Madison for more than 60 years. Jet aircraft have been operating out of Truax for decades. Anyone who chose to live there within the past 50 years made this decision knowing this. The F-16s have been stationed there for 3 decades. Mayor and City of Madison Alders,

I am appalled, that at a time when our City and State should be focusing on addressing the COVID-19 pandemic, that the Council seems more concerned to push through agenda Item 77 without due process. What happened to public notice and participation? I am opposed to this resolution, but I am also opposed to the course of action, or lack of, that the Council has taken regarding the resolution. It is immoral and unethical that these proceedings are being held while our Airmen and Guard Members are deployed, putting their lives on the line for us, and are unable to participate in the process.

I live on the near East side of Madison. Our home is in flight paths of commercial jets out of Dane County Regional Airport and aircraft (jets and helicopters) from Truax Field. To me, the noise criticism of the F-35s is convenient and unsubstantiated. I know from more than 25 years living here, that commercial flights create deeper, louder and longer noise than the F-16s. Due to their speed, the F-16s have a much shorter interval (seconds) of loud noise from their engines as they pass over. It also doesn't occur multiple times a day as with commercial flights. Commercial air traffic noise is every day, all day, beginning at 6:00 a.m. until the last evening flight (after 8pm). It is a deeper and more prolonged, enough to rattle windows. You can't complain about one and not the other. Neither annoys me. I chose to live here. It's a byproduct of living in an urban area.

What are the potential long-term economic impacts regarding our Air National Guard, Truax Field and the military jets? The F-16s are approaching the end of their service life. Without the 115th Fighter Wing mission, what does that bode for us and them and the City of Madison, WI?

Tonight's meeting is not the time or place for this last minute agenda item. The Resolution needs to be brought to the public for participation and deliberation, but after we focus our attention on the essential business of the COVID-19 crisis and our public health. I completely and unequivocally support having the F-35s at Truax Field in Madison. Anyone alder who does not should be ashamed. The members of the Air Guard are part of our community and dedicated to selflessly serving their state and nation. How do I know? My dad was at Truax as a fighter pilot from 1958-1989. He was the base commander. He dedicated his life to protecting our state and nation. He coined their motto, "dedicated to excellence". This dedication to absolute excellence continues and anyone who opposes the F-35s has failed to educate themselves and is deliberately ignorant or deeply prejudiced and anti-military.

Truax field and the Dane County airport have been at their location in Madison for more than 60 years. Jet aircraft have been operating out of Truax for decades. Anyone who chose to live there within the past 50 years made this decision knowing this. The F-16s have been stationed there for 3 decades. Before that, the A-10 jets were stationed for close to 15 years. Meanwhile, the Dane County airport has expanded exponentially, serving businesses and travelers. The number of F 16 and proposed F 35 flights is minimal compared to regular airport traffic from 5 am-12 pm 7 days per week. Remember how we felt on 9/11, so afraid and vulnerable? The Guard was literally here to protect us. (I'm also old enough to remember the Cuban missile crisis and my dad being deployed to stay out at Truax on high alert.) Groups who oppose the F-35s come off as selfish, ignorant and prejudiced against the military and especially clueless about the role of the National Guard. We lived on the east side for 25 years and felt the anti-military sentiment and endured snide, snobby remarks. But we felt we led by example and educated people because they had no family history of military service and sacrifice.

I am appalled, that at a time when our City and State should be focusing on addressing the COVID-19 pandemic, that the Council seems more concerned to push through agenda Item 77 without due process. What happened to public notice and participation? I am opposed to this resolution, but I am also opposed to the course of action, or lack of, that the Council has taken regarding the resolution. It is immoral and unethical that these proceedings are being held while our Airmen and Guard Members are deployed, putting their lives on the line for us, and are unable to participate in the process.

I live on the near East side of Madison. Our home is in flight paths of commercial jets out of Dane County Regional Airport and aircraft (jets and helicopters) from Truax Field. To me, the noise criticism of the F-35s is convenient and unsubstantiated. I know from more than 25 years living here, that commercial flights create deeper, louder and longer noise than the F-16s. Due to their speed, the F-16s have a much shorter interval (seconds) of loud noise from their engines as they pass over. It also doesn't occur multiple times a day as with commercial flights. Commercial air traffic noise is every day, all day, beginning at 6:00 a.m. until the last evening flight (after 8pm). It is a deeper and more prolonged, enough to rattle windows. This is the first time I have felt the urge to speak up in a a political setting and it's for reasons Ill outline below:

We should not be questioning the logic of the U.S. National Guard and Air Force in choosing Madison as a prime location. If you have even flown out of Dane County Airport to Chicago you know that flight is as short as 25 minutes in a commercial jet. Our national security is dependent on our air force capacity to react to a critical situation immediately. The tragedy of 9/11 is not lost on us. We were there. Affordable housing and diversity are a top priority for me professionally and personally. The capacity to balance priorities and see all sides of this issue is absolutely critical to this decision. I don't believe the council should not be considering this item at this crucial time. However, if you choose to vote for or against, I encourage you to vote against this item.

I ask that the entire council do the right thing and refuse to consider and vote on this item at this moment or to oppose it. This item should be referred.
