Good Morning Ledell,

The City has several locations where U-turns are permitted with similar street width and conditions, many are on University Avenue. Some examples of intersections with permitted U-turns are: University/Thorstrand, Highbury/University, and Blackhawk/University. The Flambeau/University intersection has restricted U-turns due to the movements of vehicles leaving the coffee shop driveway and the volume of pedestrians crossing University Avenue at this location.

Traffic Engineering, while not terribly thrilled about the alignment, finds the proposed driveway width (22') to be acceptable, our minimum commercial driveway width is 20'. If Fire requires additional modifications to the driveway to meet their standards, Traffic has no objections. In Traffic Engineering's opinion, the one access point will be sufficient in accommodating Traffic to/from the site, the applicant has also completed a traffic study to confirm this.

Ledell,

There have been no comments from Ald. Furman or the Spring Harbor NA regarding the Degen project.

Also, the applicant informed us late Friday that he is requesting referral to either April 27 or a May meeting to make some revisions to the proposed development. We will share the date of the referral with you at our 4:00 PM coordination meeting.

Neither Traffic Engineering or the Fire Department commented on the access issue you referenced in your first message below. Sean Malloy and Bill Sullivan from those respective agencies are copied.

Regarding the U-turn at University and Flambeau, the most noteworthy reason for the concern is the intersection is signed "No U-Turn," so the movement is illegal. More technically than that, the width of University there does not allow a U-turn to be safely executed. The designed U-turn 250 feet east of Flambeau (I think the report says 300) occurs where University is wide enough to safely stage and then execute the U-turn. In addition to asking Sean for his comments on the U-turn question, Lt. Lori Chalecki from MPD-Midtown is copied; she also raised a concern about U-turns at Flambeau with us early in the review for this project.
