


# Demolition Report

#### **36 West Towne Mall**





- Commercial building constructed in 1971
- Applicant had accidentally filed for 66 West Town Mall, which LC found had no known historic value
- Preservation Planner filed report of finding of no known historic value for project to move forward at Plan Commission



#### Staff recommendation: No known historic value

- 4201 N Sherman Ave (4000 Packers Ave)
  - Home constructed 1952, n.d. for agricultural buildings (older Quonset)
- 160 Westgate Mall
  - Commercial building constructed 1959, remodeled
    1996
- 1837 Aberg Ave
  - Commercial building constructed 1968, remodeled
    1998
- 1825 Aberg Ave
  - Commercial building constructed 1981
- 1818 Packers Ave
  - Two-unit residential constructed 1930. No preservation file, significant alterations
- 1814 Packers Ave
  - Commercial building constructed 1930, remodeled 1981. Garage constructed 1945. No preservation file, significant alterations

- 1802 Packers Ave
  - Single family home constructed 1900. No preservation file, significant alterations
- 133 E Lakeside St
  - VFW Hall, constructed 1966. No preservation file
- 2812 E Johnson St
  - Three-unit apartment, constructed 1920. No preservation file
- 2902 E Washington Ave
  - Commercial building constructed 1951, remodeled 1975. No preservation file
- 401 North Lawn Ave
  - Originally 1<sup>st</sup> Church of the Nazarene, constructed 1949; converted to daycare in 1974. No preservation file, significant alterations












#### 9 N Hancock Street



- Constructed 1894 per Assessor; 1892 per preservation file
- See attached reports
- Associated with the Pfund family, possibly significant as the boyhood home of noted physicist August Pfund







- Constructed 1866 per preservation file, 1890 per assessor. Additions in 1915, 1935, 1938
- Brick Italianate house, brick Mediterranean Revival storefront addition
- Originally Scheibel residence and florist shop



- Friss Jewelers, Standard Brands grocery store, and Kirby Home Sanitation System vacuum cleaners


- Constructed 1930, remodeled 1968

- Dorfman dentist office and the Kassabaum painting business





- Constructed 1927 per preservation file, 1928 per Assessor
- Originally part of A.A. Link Commercial Building
- Longtime barbershop of Wagner and Helm families





- Constructed 1927 or 1929 per preservation file, 1930 per Assessor
- Originally part of A.A. Link Commercial Building
- House Oliver Olson Jewelry Store (1930-1943)

- No preservation file



- Constructed 1912 per preservation file, 1914 per Assessor
- Brickwork by Balch & Lippert in 1923
- Law, Law & Potter addition in 1964
- Longtime home of Madison Fireproof
  Warehouse Company
- 1951, company expanded to include moving vans
