### Homeless Services - Short Term Response

- Removed families from Salvation Army shelter to allow more space for single women
- Identified and moved higher risk persons (60+, underlying health conditions or pregnant) into safer quarters
- Set up new overnight shelter space for single men to allow for social distancing
- Established separate accommodations for homeless persons exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19
- Issued Executive Order #2 Supporting safe outdoor space for people experiencing unsheltered homelessness

#### Number Served as of 05/14/20

7 hotels are under contract with Dane County.

• 59 families at 2 hotels • About 200 people
<ul> <li>210 individuals referred to hotels</li> <li>181 currently in hotels</li> <li>50 people on referral list</li> </ul>
<ul><li>72 people have used facility</li><li>Recent census has been in single digits</li></ul>
<ul> <li>80 single men on average at Warner Park (overnight only)</li> <li>40 single women at Salvation Army (24-hour shelter)</li> </ul>

# Summary of Services Provided at Hotels

- Salvation Army provides case management for families
- 24/7 staffing on site by Focus Counseling
- Housing navigation services by Focus Counseling
- 3 meals daily (Breakfast and Dinner only at Single Men's Shelter)
- On-site security
- Nurses on site at Medical Respite Center 12 hours per day
- Tele-case management by Focus Counseling at Medical Respite Center

# Impacts- Budget, Staffing, Community

- Approximate monthly cost for hotel lodging, support staff, meals (including Warner Park) and security is \$1.5 million - financed primarily by Dane County (CARES Act).
- City has borne costs to set up Warner Park, manage intake at hotels, provide Metro service to hotels and men's shelter and provide PPE equipment to shelter and outreach staff.
- Portable toilets and handwashing stations have been installed to support unsheltered homeless in downtown
- The Salvation Army currently serving 2x its normal family caseload.
- The Beacon homeless day shelter continues to operate as normal.
- Warner Park Community Center will be offline until new site identified for men's shelter.

# Safe Outdoor Spaces

- Center for Disease Control (CDC) has advised against disrupting encampments during community spread of COVID-19.
- Designation of Temporary Permissible Encampment (TPE) may be obtained.
  - Site is located at least 500 feet from residential property;
  - Site not in a flood plan or other low lying area susceptible to flooding, or otherwise deemed unsafe;
  - Is accessible via public property or right of way;
  - Accessible for delivery and servicing of portable toilets, hand washing stations and trash containers;
  - Usable area is sufficient to practice recommend social distancing;
  - Presence will not prevent, disrupt or interfere with the intended public use of space;
  - Will not prevent normal maintenance or upkeep of site/or its facilities;
  - Site not located in environmentally sensitive area.

# **Temporary Services at TPE Sites**

- Portable toilets and hand washing stations at authorized encampments where people lack access to restroom faculties.
- Trash containers and collection.
- Regular visits by outreach workers to facilitate referrals to housing or shelter, provisions of wellness checks, dissemination of COVID-19 educational materials and distribution of basic supplies and hygiene kits.

#### Homeless Services- Intermediate Plans

Prepare to meet ongoing needs for safe emergency shelter.

- Identify new site(s) to serve single men upon closure of the temporary operations at Warner Park Community Center.
- Continue to engage with hotels to secure accommodations for families and those at higher risk.
- Extend contracts to ensure COVID-19 Medical Respite Center for homeless individuals is available until vaccine is developed.
- Expand services to secure permanent housing solutions
  - Target housing navigation and supportive services to individuals in hotels.
  - Expand Rapid Rehousing programs.
  - Cultivate more relationships with landlords willing to partner with supportive housing programs.

# Homeless Services- Long Term Plans

- Pursue goals of building permanent purpose-built shelter facilities
- Explore new low-cost housing options for singles (i.e. pay-to-stay, transitional housing, Single Room Occupancy)
- Add more very low-income rental housing units
- Expand social services
