I was deeply concerned to learn of the dramatic budget cuts that have already been made at Monona Terrace along with the redeployment of staff to other city agencies due to COVID-19. I am further concerned that if the room tax funding to Monona Terrace is cut that this could further impact staffing and cause the facility to defer upkeep and maintenance. Please fund Monona Terrace at the predetermined levels with the unfortunate adjustments necessary due to the current room tax shortfall. In these unprecedented financial times this is the most equitable solution when there are so many financial hardships for all.

I am a Madison based planner who has enjoyed working with the professional staff at Monona Terrace for almost 20 years. We have hosted our Major Customer Council (MCC) meetings several times a year at this well maintained facility for many reasons including the exceptional staff, perfect location, and convenient parking. Adequately funding Monona Terrace's future is a necessary investment in our local economy and our community and I truly hope you will continue to fund this Madison icon at the current levels adjusted for the room tax shortfall so that it can continue to be a place where I want to host my events, a place where tourists naturally want to come to visit, and a place where the community gathers.

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
