Goals of an effective program

- Outcomes focused
 - Is safer
 - Encourages walking, biking, transit
- Equitable
 - All Ages & Abilities
 - All areas of the city
 - All kinds of roadways (local, collector, arterials)
- Good public process/access
 - How issues are reported
 - How residents can advocate for selection
 - Transparent
 - Accessible
 - Inclusive
 - Outreach & Engagement
- Efficient
 - Good use of time for staff, commissioners, alders, residents, etc.
 - Area/corridor intervention rather than street by street or block by block
 - Cost-effective

Components of an effective program:

- Requests/getting issues into the program
- Creative, flexible, all options on the table
- Evaluating requests/determining solutions/interventions
- Prioritizing recommended interventions
- Public input
- Decision making
- Implementation
- Evaluate effectiveness of individual interventions (include resident feedback/satisfaction)
- Assessment/review/make changes of program
- Funding
