

2021 BUDGET CHANGES

MAJOR BUDGET CHANGES

- Adds \$106k to the Youth Employment subservice to expand Operation Fresh Start's youth employment contract.
- Transfer \$100,000 from Direct Appropriations to the Community Development Division Community Support Services. The transfer increases funding for the Peer Support contract funding with the Focused Interruption Coalition (FIC) by \$100,000 from \$200,000 to \$300,000.
- Transfers \$250,000 previously budgeted for the Community Building & Engagement (CBE) Program, where it will be combined with \$150,000 from Emerging Opportunities Program (EOP) funds to support an initiative to help meet ongoing needs associated with the COVID-19 pandemic.
 - Transfers \$75,000 for violence prevention community agency contracts in Community Support Services to increase the COVID Relief Fund to \$475,000.
 - Increase funding by another \$250,000 to go towards activities that will help prevent evictions or loss of housing stemming from the pandemic.
 - ** Increases the total COVID Relief fund to \$725,000
 - **Use of these funds will be for activities for which state and federal resources are not available
