Bolz Conservatory Update and Request for Extension of Admission Fee

Due to the COVID19 Pandemic, the Bolz Conservatory was closed from mid-March through mid-October 2020. In September 2020, the Board of Park Commissioners approved a request from Olbrich Botanical Gardens staff increase the admission fee (from \$2 to \$6) to the Bolz Conservatory and adjust the revenue sharing between Olbrich Botanical Society and the City of Madison. This increased fee is required in order to provide staffing that can monitor the conservatory and ensure visitor safety while COVID19 is still present. The Board of Park Commissioners approved this request with the condition that there be a sunset clause of January of 2021 and that staff provide a report of the reopening report at the January meeting.

The Bolz Conservatory opened to the public on October 12, 2020, following much planning by staff. Benches were removed and a limit of 30 individuals at one time was set as the capacity. (total capacity is 200). Capacity is tracked by the cashier using a simple in/out counter. Masks are required. The reopening announcement was low key without advertising on social media. Overall, visitors have been compliant and capacity has seldom been reached. Staff concerns about a waiting line in the lobby and unmasked visitors have not been a problem. Some individuals have been seen with their masks lowered, but corrective action has been taken immediately by staff.

Verbal comments have been minimal--both positive and negative. Parents of small children have been pleased to have a place to visit. Occasionally, there is a concern about the fee, but donor-funded scholarships help with that. Even though visitation is way down compared to previous years, staff are pleased to be able to offer a quality experience during the pandemic.
