Amounts of Funds Estimated in Dec

- City of Madison Estimated \$7,500,0000
- ▶ Dane County Estimated \$8,500,0000
 - At least 90% of total funds received by Grantee
 (City/County) must be used for direct finance assistance for tenants.
 - Then 10% eligible for admin and/or housing stability services.
 - As of 1/27/21, federal regulations not released only summary guidance.

Direct Financial Assistance

- Rent Arrears, Rent 3 months, Utilities (Dane County/City prioritize arrears only in this cycle of funds)
- Grantee must verify no duplication of benefits
- Income documentation in file (no self-certification)
- ► Tenants receiving financial assistance from federal government to cover 70% of rent (i.e. Public Housing, Section 8) not eligible

Admin and/or Housing Stability Services

- Admin- overhead costs (i.e. processing application and/or reporting to US Treasury)
- Case Management
- Mediation
- Tenant/Landlord counseling

As of 01/27 Federal Guidance not published. Webinars and summaries say more information on Housing Stability Services will be provided by Secretary of Treasury in final guidance.

This is Federal/US Treasury funds included in City Resolution for community partners.*

Direct Rental Assistance in City

- Dane County allocating funding in City of Madison \$3,000,000
- City of Madison allocating at least 90% of award; \$6,750,000

Concerns

- Ensure County/City have similar program designs so don't have different requirements based on funding source.
- Without common database how is County/City ensuring tenant not accessing funding in duplication?

Solutions

- City/County working together on program design.
- City will follow County lead on rent assistance being used in same database.

Program Design as of 01/27/2020

- Funds will pay rental arrears up to 6 months up to the fair market rental rate plus 15%.
- ► Households making 50% CMI

Per current Federal Guidelines (not in final Federal Regulations yet)

- Prioritize households in which one or more member is unemployed and has been unemployed for longer than 90 days will be prioritized among that population
- Must collect income documentation (no self certification)
- Must document experienced reduction income, incurred significant costs or experienced financial hardship
- Document outreach to property management, must attempt to call or email over 21 calendar-day period to participate
- Demonstrate risk of homelessness or housing instability, must document past due rent or eviction notice
