





# Community Food Access Competitive Grants Program

- \$150k in approved funding to support the competitive grants program
  - \$50k from 2021 SEED Grants
  - \$100k from Healthy Retail Access Program
- Maximum individual grant amount is \$25,000
- Proposals that focus on alleviating food security issues exacerbated by COVID will receive priority but are not a requirement of the grant program
- Funding is very flexible and supports any project costs related to food access and food security efforts





#### Community Food Access Grants Deliberations Process

- Phase I: 12 MFPC and DCFC members and 2 community members were identified to form 7 individual review teams
  - Those review teams scored their assigned proposals
  - Staff averaged scores and then ranked the proposals
- Phase II: MFPC-DCFC Work Groups established ad hoc meetings to make funding recommendations based on the rankings of proposals received

\*\*12 organizations recommended for \$150,00 in funding \*\*

#### **CFA GRANTS NEXT STEPS**

- Because of the way the originating legislation was written governing the Healthy Community Food Systems Fund as a whole, funding authority lies with the MFPC for funding amounts under \$50,000
- If agreed upon, a motion will be needed at the March 9, MFPC DCFC meeting to finalize funding
- After final funding authority is provided, staff will notify grant funding recipients and non-recipients via email and begin contracting with individual organizations
