Dear Mr. Kraemer;

The one-lot Certified Survey Map of property generally addressed as 6102 Manufacturers Drive and 3842 Merchant Street, Section 16, Township 8N, Range 10E, City of Madison, Dane County, Wisconsin, is hereby **conditionally approved**. The property is zoned (IL) Industrial—Limited District). The conditions of approval from the reviewing agencies to be satisfied prior to final approval and recording of the CSM are:

- 1. This property has deferred assessments for the Northeast Industrial Area Assessment District Phase 1, Northeast Industrial Area Assessment District Phase 1, File #15751, Northeast Industrial Area Assessment District Phase 2, File #9371, and Hanson Road Neighborhood Sanitary Sewer and Water Assessment District, File #4464, which are due and payable prior to final approval.
- 2. Madison Metropolitan Sewerage District (MMSD) charges are due and payable prior to City Engineering Division sign-off, unless otherwise collected with a Developer's/ Subdivision Contract. Contact Mark Moder (261-9250) to obtain the final MMSD billing a minimum of two (2) working days prior to requesting City Engineering Division signoff.
- 3. A minimum of two (2) working days prior to requesting City Engineering signoff on the CSM, contact either Tim Troester (West) at 261-1995 (ttroester@cityofmadison.com) or Brenda Stanley (East) at 261-9127 (bstanley@cityofmadison.com) to obtain the final stormwater utility charges that are due and payable prior to sub-division of the properties. The stormwater utility charges (as all utility charges) are due for the previous months of service and must be cleared prior to the land division (and subsequent obsolesces of the existing parcel).
- 4. Prior to approval, this project shall comply with Chapter 37 of the Madison General Ordinances regarding stormwater management. Specifically, this development is required to submit a Storm Water Management Permit application, associated permit fee, Stormwater Management Plan, and

Storm Water Management Report to City Engineering. The Storm Water Management Plan & Report shall include compliance with the following:

Submit prior to plan sign-off, a stormwater management report stamped by a P.E. registered in the State of Wisconsin.

Provide electronic copies of any stormwater management modeling or data files including SLAMM, RECARGA, TR-55, HYDROCAD, Sediment loading calculations, or any other electronic modeling or data files. If calculations are done by hand or are not available electronically, the hand copies or printed output shall be scanned to a PDF file and provided to City Engineering. (POLICY and MGO 37.09(2))

Detain the 2-, 10-, 100- and 200-year storm events, matching post development rates to predevelopment rates and using the design storms identified in MGO Chapter 37.

Provide infiltration of 90% of the pre-development infiltration volume.

Reduce TSS by 80% (control the 5-micron particle) off of newly developed areas compared to no controls.

Submit a draft Stormwater Management Maintenance Agreement (SWMA) for review and approval that covers inspection and maintenance requirements for any BMP used to meet stormwater management requirements on this project.

- 5. Add a note to the CSM: No change in grades shall be allowed without the approval of the City Engineer.
- 6. This lot is required to comply with MGO Chapter 37 at the time of development. The drainage easement on the north side of the lot cannot be used to meet those requirements.

- 7. Grant a Public Sidewalk Easement(s) to the City on the face of this CSM along the south side of this CSM where public sidewalk improvements cross into this property. Contact Jeff Quamme for the required easement language to be placed on the CSM. (jrquamme@cityofmadison.com)
- 8. The pending Certified Survey Map application for this property shall be completed and recorded with the Dane County Register of Deeds, the new parcel data created by the Assessor's Office, and the parcel data available to Zoning and Building Inspection staff prior to issuance of building permits for new construction.
- 9. In accordance with Chapter 236, Wisconsin Statutes, the applicant must show the type, location and width of any and all easements on a Plat or CSM. Clearly identify the difference between existing easements (cite recording data) and easements which are being conveyed by the land division. Identify the owner and/or benefiting interest of all easements. Include dimensioning that is adequate to locate the easement limits.
- 10. Grasskamp Way has been vacated and discontinued per resolution recorded as Document No. 5304795 with an easement for City of Madison Utilities retained within the vacated right of way. This

shall be properly shown and noted on the face of the CSM with text referring to the recorded documents.

- 11. Insert standard language pre MGO 16.23(9)(d)2.a. verbatim. When done, all of the previous non-exclusive easements for drainage easements are released and new drainage easements defined by the current proposed Certified Survey Map are granted.
- 12. Notes 1, 3, 6, 9, 10 and 14 from the plat of The Center for Industry and Commerce shall be placed on the CSM and properly referenced to the plat.
- 13. Add a note to the CSM that lands within this CSM benefit from Declaration of Easements per Document No. 3671349.
- 14. Add a note to the CSM that lands within this CSM are subject to Amended and Restated Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions per Document No. 5461197 and amended by Document Nos. 5562138 and 5344856.
- 15. Show and note the Avigation Easement per Document No 2794376.
- 16. The portion of the Public Utility Easement per the plat of Center for Industry and Commerce over the west side of existing Lot 28 has been released by Document Nos. 5338216, 5338217, 5338218 and 5346420.
- 17. Wisconsin Administrative Code A-E 7.08 identifies when Public Land System (PLS) tie sheets must be filed with the Dane County Surveyor's office. The Developer's Surveyor and/or Applicant must submit copies of required tie sheets or monument condition reports (with current tie sheet attached) for all monuments, including center of sections of record, used in this survey, to Jeff Quamme, City Engineering (jrquamme@cityofmadison.com).
- 18. In accordance with Section s. 236.18(8), Wisconsin Statutes, the applicant shall reference City of Madison WCCS Dane Zone, 1997 Coordinates on all PLS corners on the Certified Survey Map in areas where this control exists. The Surveyor shall identify any deviation from City Master Control with recorded and measured designations. Visit the Dane County Surveyor's Office for current tie sheets and control data that has been provided by the City of Madison.
- 19. Prior to Engineering final sign-off by main office for Certified Survey Maps, the final CSM shall be submitted in PDF format by email transmittal to Engineering Land Records Coordinator Jeff Quamme (jrquamme@cityofmadison.com) for final technical review and approval. This submittal must occur a minimum of two working days prior to final Engineering Division sign-off.
- 20. Remove all setback lines shown on the Certified Survey Map. Setbacks are a zoning issue that is subject to change and any setbacks required by private covenants are subject to change and shall not be shown on the face of the map.
- 21. The sanitary sewer in the northeasterly corner is shown incorrectly and is missing manhole and bend.

22. The applicant shall submit to Jeff Quamme, prior to final Engineering sign-off of the subject CSM, one (1) digital CADD drawing in a format compatible with AutoCAD. The digital CADD file(s) shall be referenced to the Dane County Coordinate System and shall contain, at minimum, the list of items stated below, each on a separate layer/level name. The line work shall be void of gaps and overlaps and match the final recorded CSM: right of way lines (public and private); lot lines; lot numbers; lot/plat dimensions; street names, and; easement lines (including wetland and floodplain boundaries).

\*This transmittal is a separate requirement than the required submittals to Engineering Streets Section for design purposes. The Developer/Surveyor shall submit new updated final plat, electronic data and a written notification to Engineering Mapping for any changes to the plat which occur subsequent to any submittal.

23. Note that records indicate deferred water main assessments exist against these parcels. Improvements which substantially change the use of the property may require any outstanding deferred assessments to be paid in full prior to proceeding with the proposed improvements (MGO Section 4.081(4)). Specific questions regarding the comments or conditions contained in this letter should be directed to the commenting agency.

A resolution approving the CSM and authorizing the City to sign it and any other documents related to the proposed land division will be approved by the Common Council at its January 5, 2021 meeting.

In order to commence the process for obtaining the necessary City signatures on the Certified Survey Map, the applicant shall e-mail the revised CSM, updated title report, and any other materials required by reviewing agencies to the reviewing planner. The reviewing planner will share the updated materials with the relevant commenting City agencies for them to verify that their conditions have been satisfied and that the secretary or designee may sign the Plan Commission approval certificate. Once the Plan Commission certificate is executed, the Planning Division will transmit the CSM to the City Clerk's Office for execution of the Common Council certificate.

Once all of the necessary City signatures have been affixed to the Certified Survey Map, the instrument will be returned electronically to the applicant by the Planning Division for printing and recording at the Dane County Register of Deeds Office. For information on recording procedures and fees, please contact the Register of Deeds at 266-4141.

Any appeal from this action, including the conditions of approval, must be filed with the Circuit Court within 30 days from the date of this letter. The approval of this CSM shall be null and void if not recorded in twelve (12) months from the date of the approving resolution or this letter, whichever is later.
