The new navigation page includes walk, bus, b-cycle, and bike directions. It also includes information on how to get a ride. It looks like it was published/updated on March 29th. I see that PHMDC is also highlighting these options on social media. These are all great!

Hi all,

Many of the groups hardest hit by the COVID-19 pandemic are more likely to rely on modes of transportation other than driving their own vehicle. The current setup of Public Health Madison and Dane County (PHMDC) mass vaccination and testing sites and the Alliant Energy Center(AEC) is very auto-oriented. Long term, the AEC Master Plan has recognized these issues. Given the critical nature of vaccine and testing distribution, this is an equity issue.

There are things that can be done now to address these inequities. First, I feel that directions should be provided on the AEC website, PHMDC website, and in email communications to people getting vaccines/testing. I looked and could not find these. I also did not see any wayfinding for people on bikes / on foot / on transit / being dropped off when I drove to the site on Saturday.

Dedicate staff time to improving access for people without cars

Create a safe, clearly designated space for people being dropped off

Provide safe, separated paths for people walking and riding bicycles

Work with Madison Metro to provide a bus stop inside the AEC campus

Set up a walk-up/bike-up lane

Provide directions and wayfinding to people using Madison Metro

Provide directions and wayfinding to people riding bikes

Provide directions and wayfinding to people being dropped off by rideshare/taxi/service agencies/friends and family

Improve directions and wayfinding on the periphery of the AEC

Improve directions and wayfinding within the interior of the AEC

I have lived in Madison for the past 6 years, relying mostly on alternative modes of transportation. I lived for 16 months without a car after losing mine in an accident without being able to afford a replacement. I have always found the Alliant Energy Center to be difficult to access without driving. I was able to get vaccinated at the AEC on Saturday from my vehicle. I feel that it would have been more difficult for me to get a vaccine without a vehicle.

Public Health Madison and Dane County and the Alliant Energy Center should do more to help people without vehicles access vaccines and testing in the context of the site.

There is some wayfinding for people walking and bike parking set up, thank you for what you have done so far!
