REPORT TO THE MONONA TERRACE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

May 20, 2021

A. Administration:

As public health restrictions are easing and events are returning, a reopening
and return to work plan is under development. To begin this process,
employee feedback has been sought. A survey to gather input about returning
to work in the office and reopening the building to the public was sent to all
staff at the end of April. Results will be used to help inform the plan.

B. Operations:

- Operations is busy covering events with limited staff. Everyone has been very flexible with rotating their work schedules to meeting building and event needs.
- Rooftop power washing continues, limited staff and weather have slowed this project.
- In early April, the cooling equipment had a test run, and the chillers passed inspection. Unfortunately, there are issues with the HVAC control air compressor. Maintenance is working on solutions to avoid the need for replacement.
- Maintenance will be sending out RFPs for capital projects that were postponed last year due to the pandemic, including: building re-caulking, tile paver work on Olin Terrace and building exterior pressure washing.
- AV wrapped up their work with the Wisconsin Department of Tourism, recording sessions for virtual conference. During the final awards ceremony, the clients had very complimentary things to say about the services and support at Monona Terrace.

C. <u>Community Relations:</u>

- Online Mindful Movement on Tuesdays at noon had a total attendance in April
 of 204 people, with an average attendance of 51. The series is sponsored by
 GHC-SCW.
- Meditation at Monona Terrace continues online Wednesdays at noon. The series is sponsored by SSM Health. Total Attendance for April was 332 people, with an average weekly attendance of 83.
- Our Wellness Talk "Nature Connection: Forest Bathing and Exploring Wisconsin's Scenic State Parks" in April had the highest attendance of the program's history, with a total of 351. The webinar held on April 22 was in partnership with the Madison Senior Center.

• Monona Terrace has collaborated with the American Institute of Architects Wisconsin to produce three Virtual Wright Design Series lectures, two of which were held in April. Texas architect Max Levy spoke about his work on April 2; the event had 131 attendees. Mark Dytham, based in Tokyo, presented on April 26 with 180 attendees. The joint lecture was held as part of AIA Wisconsin's annual conference, held virtually this year.

D. Gift Shop:

- The Gift Shop remains closed to the public; but is open when suitable for booked events, for instance: the Home Remodel Store and Precision Arts Dance Competition in April.
- Gift Shop flyers/coupons were provided to Downtown Madison BID for their welcome bags to new home/condo buyers in the downtown area for 2021.
- Website sales are still in operation, including some curbside pickup orders.
- The Gift Shop Manager is assisting the City's Organizational Development Team.

E. Sales and Marketing:

- The April booking pace report is attached.
- Monona Terrace was represented by the sales team at the following virtual networking functions and other industry events: DMI–What's Up Downtown, DMI–New Faces New Places, Madison Chamber's Lunch (UP)date, DMI Nosh at Noon, AFP Happy Hour, IAVM Town Hall Meeting, Creative Sponsorship Ideas for Digital and Hybrid Events webinar, (PCMA) Pandemic Protocol–Who's Responsible for Enforcing Event Safety?, IAVM–CC Sales Round Table, DMI–The Madison and Downtown Milwaukee Exchange and MPI Spring Education Day.
- On April 19, the Director of Sales and Event Services Manager were invited as virtual guest speakers to discuss Event Safety Protocols at the Badger Bay Association Management Firm all-staff meeting.
- MightyCon comic convention will be returning in August of 2021. They have been with Monona Terrace since 2016. Also returning is Access Community Health for their Annual Celebration in April of 2022, which will be their 17th year here. Finally, the Capital High and Shabazz Graduation will be here in June of 2021. They first hosted this annual event in 2017 but due to the pandemic had to cancel for 2020. It's exciting for the students and their families to be able to meet in-person.

F. Event Services:

 Public Health Madison & Dane County's Emergency Order #16 is in effect from May 5 at 12:01 am through June 2 at 12:01 am. This order includes the following categories that apply to upcoming events booked at Monona Terrace and the number of guests permitted in each category.

Gatherings (Section 2): Gatherings are limited to these numbers, not including employees:

Indoors: 350 people or less if any food or drink is offered or provided

500 people or less if NO food or drink is offered or provided. Guests must maintain 6 feet physical distance. Face masks are

required (unless a guest is eating or drinking)

Outdoors: No capacity limit. Guests must maintain 6 feet physical distance.

Face masks are needed only if guests cannot maintain a

distance of 6 feet

Temporary & Permanent Retail Stores (Section 6 c): Limit the number of individuals at the temporary or permanent retail store (excluding employees) up to 75% of approved capacity levels.
