## LETTER OF INTENT TO THE CITY OF MADISON

Remove all buildings and foundations, to include house (396 S.F.), decks, and Garden shed/garage (160 S.F.).

Disconnect all utilities, follow them back to the sidewalk, and reconnect them to the new house.

Remove existing concrete drive, and apron between curb & sidewalk.

There are no large trees to be removed, only a couple of small shrubs.

We would then rebuild a new foundation; house (752 S.F.); and new garage (16'  $\times$ 24'). In accordance to current city standards.

Install new concrete drive, and Apron between sidewalk and curb, at new location on lot.

Cut-out curb at new drive location.

Reconnect utilities to new house.

Proposed schedule is to start as soon as permits are approved, and complete in approximately 3-4 months.

The existing house is small and in need of major work. The interior is in good but failing condition. The basement has been remodeled several times, and would not meet todays standards. It has 2 types of foundation, stone with cement block on top. It is very short, less than 6' ht., and leaks water. Also, the basement has no interior access, only an outside entrance. If there is something missing let us know and we will get it to you ASAP. If there is any way to approve of this Demolition permit at the July meeting, it would be greatly appreciated.
