Subject: Pros and Cons of Alder District Concepts 5b, 6, 7a, and 7b

Staff highlights some of the advantage positive and negative characteristics of several Concepts.

## Concept #5b

Pros

- Leopold and Arbor Hills located in the same district (D10).
- Oak Park Terrace community (between Packers Avenue and the airport) located in D18.

### Cons

- D8 does not include all UW-Madison residence halls.
- Neighborhood splits are more common than Concept #7a.
  - May be possible to configure D9/D19 border similar to the border in Concepts 7a/7b.
- D12 extends from Warner Park to N. Patterson St., splitting Tenney-Lapham NA.

# Concept #6

Pros

- Largely maintains D2 and D6 configuration on the Isthmus.
- Greentree, Meadowood, and Prairie Hills located in the same alder district.

# Cons

- Oak Park Terrace community (between Packers Avenue and the airport) is isolated from the rest of D12.
- Arbor Hills (D10) and Leopold (D14) neighborhoods located in different alder districts.
- D8 does not include all UW-Madison residence halls.

## Concept #7a

Pros

- Minimizes neighborhoods split between alder districts.
- All UW-Madison residence halls located in one district (D8).
- Retains Tenney-Lapham NA in one district (D6).
- Oak Park Terrace community (between Packers Avenue and the airport) located in D18.

### Cons

- D19 crosses the Beltline.
- Arbor Hills (D10) and Leopold (D14) neighborhoods located in different alder districts.

### Concept #7b

Pros

- Retains Tenney-Lapham in one district (D6).
- All UW-Madison residence halls located in one district (D8).
- East side districts more compact.

#### Cons

- Arbor Hills (D10) and Leopold (D14) neighborhoods are in different alder districts.
- Ridgewood Neighborhood split.
- D16 crosses Stoughton Road.
- Oak Park Terrace community (between Packers Avenue and the airport) is isolated from the rest of D17.
