<u>LEGISTAR – File No. 67344 – Substitute Body</u>

DRAFTER'S ANALYSIS: This ordinance creates a ban on removing or disabling a cat's claws by performing a declawing procedure, except as necessary for therapeutic purposes, and creates bail deposits for violations of the ordinance.

This substitute removes the exception for wild cats and any references to a licensed veterinarian.

The Common Council of the City of Madison do hereby ordain as follows:

1. Section 23.66 entitled "Prohibiting Declawing Procedures" of the Madison General Ordinances is created as follows:

"23.66 Prohibiting Declawing Procedures

(1) Definitions.

<u>Cat</u> means an animal of the taxonomic family felidae, except an animal that is a member of an exotic or native wild cat species.

<u>Declawing procedure</u> means an onychectomy, partial or complete phalangectomy, partial digital amputation, tendonectomy, or other procedure to alter a cat's toes, claws, or paws to prevent the normal functioning of the cat's toes, claws, or paws. "Declawing procedure" does not include the trimming of nonviable claw husk or placing nonpermanent nail caps.

<u>Onychectomy</u> means a procedure in which a portion of the paw of a cat is amputated to remove or disable a claw, including, without limitation, procedures commonly referred to as declawing.

<u>Partial digital amputation</u> means a procedure for the excision of some or all of one or more of the phalanges of the paw of a cat.

<u>Phalangectomy</u> means a procedure for the excision of one or more of the phalanges of the paw of a cat.

<u>Tendonectomy</u> means a procedure in which the tendons to the limbs, paws, or toes of a cat are cut or modified so that the cat's claws cannot function normally.

<u>Therapeutic purpose</u> means for the purpose of addressing an existing or recurring infection, disease, injury, or abnormal condition in the claw that jeopardizes the cat's <u>physical</u> health and only when addressing that infection, disease, injury, or abnormal condition is determined by a licensed veterinarian to be a medical necessity. "Therapeutic purpose" does not include cosmetic or aesthetic purposes or the purpose of making a cat more convenient to keep or handle.

- (2) It shall be unlawful to remove or disable a cat's claws by performing a declawing procedure, except as specified in subdivision (3).
- (3) Exception. This section does not apply to a <u>partial or complete</u> phalangectomy performed solely for a therapeutic purpose. A <u>licensed veterinarian determines lf</u>

- <u>it is determined</u> that it is necessary to perform a phalangectomy for a therapeutic purpose, the licensed veterinarian, shall document the purposed for performing the phalangectomy shall be documented.
- (4) Any person violating this section shall be subject to a forfeiture of up to two thousand dollars (\$2000). Each and every day of violation may be considered a separate offense."
- 2. Subdivision (a) of Subsection (3) entitled "Schedule of Deposits" of Section 1.08 entitled "Issuance of Citations and Complaints for Violations of Certain Ordinances and Providing a Schedule of Cash Deposits" of the Madison General Ordinances is amended by creating and amending the following:

3. Subsection (4) entitled "Issuance of Citations" of Section 1.08 entitled "Issuance of Citations for Violations of Certain Ordinances and Providing a Schedule of Cash Deposits" of the Madison General Ordinances is amended as follows:

EDITOR'S NOTE: A new or revised forfeiture range must be approved by the Municipal Judge prior to adoption. This revision has been so approved.
