**Ocean's Laugh** is a company that sells flower bath kits and jars.

**OnlyOne Photography** is a company that offers photography services and art for wall decoration.

**Restoration Soap & Bodycare** is a soap company that produces natural and sustainable sourced products using unique oil blends, purees and botanicals from around the globe.



Business and property ownership is a vital pathway to economic empowerment. For Madison to make meaningful progress in addressing racial disparities the City must go beyond programs focused on addressing basic needs, and direct more resources and strategies toward building wealth and economic empowerment among communities that are not sharing in the City's prosperity. The Commercial Ownership Assistance Program is a City of Madison effort focused on helping business owners expand their enterprises by transitioning from renting space to owning commercial property for their establishments.



We launched the pilot program in March of 2021 and proud to assist the following businesses build generational wealth:

- Go-oh Grocery A soon to be grocery store owned by two individuals of color. Go-oh Grocery will transform an old Gentleman's Club into a community Grocery Store.
- Loan amount: \$195,000
- 3554 E. Washington Avenue





- Anesis Family Therapy An African American female owned business that focuses on mental health therapy within the BIPOC community. Anesis Family Therapy has grown from four employees to over forty in just five years.
- Loan amount: \$250,000
- 815 Forward Drive

- Patterson and Richardson Properties A partnership between JP Hair Design and KnitCircus Yarns that purchased three buildings within the property which houses over 40 diverse businesses. 550 Grand Canyon Drive
  - Loan amount: \$250,000

# Carts in Parks – Vending Pilot Program

- Vending pilot program ran 7/25/21 10/31/21
- \$50,000 NACTO grant received
  - Daily vending
  - Community lead events
  - Community partner Latino Chamber of Commerce
- 27 food cart businesses participated
- 15 City parks
- 11 businesses participated in the Guaranteed Sales
  Program
- 13+ community lead events supported
- Fee waivers and event support provided
- NRT neighborhoods prioritized

## **OTHER PROJECTS**

### **Neighborhood Investment Grants**

The City of Madison submitted two proposals for the WI Dept of Admin Neighborhood Investment Grants the week of Nov 8, 2021. Both proposals centered on investing dollars in critical infrastructure projects that will serve the cultural and economic interests of Madison residents.

### •Madison Public Market - \$4 million

The City submitted a \$4m grant proposal to support the construction and build-out of the Madison Public Market

### •Truman Olson/South Park Street Grocery - \$3 million

The City submitted a \$3m grant proposal to support the build-out of the grocery condo located within the larger Fourteen02 affordable housing development located on S Park Street
