6. <u>75031</u> Buildings Proposed for Demolition - 2023

A motion was made by Harris, seconded by McLean, to recommend to the Plan Commission that the buildings at 445 W Johnson Street, 437 W Johnson Street, 215 N Bassett Street, 217 N Bassett Street, 430 W Dayton Street, 434 W Dayton Street, 438 W Dayton Street, and 440 W Dayton Street have no known historic value, but the growing loss of this type of building has the potential to impact the vernacular context of Madison's built environment. The motion passed by voice vote/other.

A motion was made by McLean, seconded by Harris, to recommend to the Plan Commission that the buildings at 219 N Bassett Street and 221 N Bassett Street have historic value as the product of an architect of note, but the buildings themselves are not historically, architecturally, or culturally significant. The Commission regrets the growing loss of the city's historic fabric, which has the potential to impact the vernacular context of Madison's built environment. The motion passed by voice vote/other.
