#### **FACILITIES REPORT**

Mark Benno reported on the chiller in Central Library that is now fully running, thanks in part to the board's approval of a non-competitive contract with NAMI that allowed the library to get the chiller fixed in a timely manner. This was very important with the summer season coming up.

#### **FRIENDS REPORT**

Tom DeChant reported on the Friends of MPL. The Friends groups are having their big sale at the Library Support Center on July 9th. Friends of South Madison raised \$5,472 with Delta Beer Lab which will go to the June 10th Story Slam at Urban League. May 16th is Book Club Cafe.

#### **FOUNDATION REPORT**

Libby Gerds reported on behalf of MPLF. Lunch for Libraries raised over \$100,000. The Month of Giving in April raised over \$100,000 as well, some of which came from matching donations. In April, ten Book Fest events brought in over 3,000 people and 870 books were given away. The State of the Foundation is on Tuesday, May 9 4-5:30 at Central.

#### SOUTH CENTRAL LIBRARY SYSTEM REPORT

Greg Mickells reported on the ground-breaking event at the new SCLS site which was attended by the Asst. Superintendent of DPI, Dr. Williams, who also visited Lakeview Library.

Eve Galanter reported that there will be some service interruptions at the end of May but should be over with after Memorial Day.

## DANE COUNTY LIBRARY SERVICE REPORT

Greg Mickells reported that DCLS is still working on the formula for the walk-in contract.
