Subdivision regulations for the City of Madison had not been updated since 1960. When they were noticed for updating in July, Alder Slack noticed that urban agriculture and community resilience in the face of climate change Task Force members proposed language that was ultimately approved by the Common Council providing a definition of urban agriculture, and adding "encourage the preservation of land for urban agriculture" to the Purpose and Introduction section of the ordinance.

Other public input planning efforts that present opportunities for advocacy and education on this topic include the Planning Division's 12 Area Plans (NorthEast and West in 2023, SouthEast and SouthWest in 2024), updating the Sustainability Plan and the Parks and Open Space Plan this fall and winter.
