NEW BUSINESS

8. <u>82433</u> Planning Division Staff Update - Northeast Area Plan

Angela Puerta, City Planning staff, discussed the Northeast Area Plan and historic resource survey that was completed as part of the planning process. Staff identified 14 sites, including 11 properties of historic interest and three areas of archaeological potential, which could benefit from a National Register designation. Staff detailed the research and survey work that was completed to identify these sites. They spoke about the difference between local landmark and National Register designations, noting that any nominations would need to brought forth with support from the property owners.

9. <u>82209</u> Landmark Plaque for 2229 Eton Ridge

Bailey said that the proposed landmark plaque language has been approved by the property owner, as required by ordinance. Gary Tipler, author of the landmark nomination, submitted some suggested edits to the plaque language, which staff thought were good. Morrison agreed that Tipler's edits were spot on and their explanation for those changes was helpful.

A motion was made by Harris, seconded by Morrison, to Approve the landmark plaque for 2229 Eton Ridge including the edits submitted by Tipler. The motion passed by voice vote/other.

10. <u>82440</u> Madison Historic District Illustrated Design Guidelines

Bailey provided background information on the illustrated design guidelines, explaining that the ordinance has already been adopted and these are simply illustrations to go along with it. She said that the illustrated design guidelines will be a living document meant to be of assistance of property owners that can be amended whenever necessary. She plans to do a public engagement process once the guidelines are accepted by the Landmarks Commission, including a training for those in historic districts. She said they could refer this item to the next meeting in order to have additional time to review the guidelines document.

A motion was made by Morrison, seconded by Harris, to Refer the item to the April 15, 2024 Landmarks Commission meeting. The motion passed by voice vote/other.

REGULAR BUSINESS

11. <u>81161</u> Buildings Proposed for Demolition - 2024
