1. 08284 Garden Plot Fees - November, 2007

The Garden Plot Working Group Work Plan and meeting calendar were distributed. The Working Group is currently meeting weekly; as well, presentations are scheduled to the CDBG and Parks Commission. There was discussion regarding the availability of the working group to include drop-in members versus continuing to hold public hearings; problem-solving around how to inform the public of proposals when they are available for discussion and comment.

2. <u>08272</u> Garden/CAC Reports - November, 2007

The Madison Community Fund has awarded a \$300,000, three year grant to Community Action Coalition for gardens. Specifically, this grant will fund five new gardens in addition to food pantry gardens.

Meadowood Park and Falk Elementary are promising prospective new garden sites. Janet will evaluate a prospective space in the Allied Drive neighborhood tomorrow. Gardening season is over.

3. 08267 School Garden Partnerships

Midvale Garden received a grant to plant fruit trees and has received training and planted said trees. The fruit trees are flourishing.

At Sandburg School, a three-section compost bin has been installed and a classroom is enthusiastically gathering food waste for the compost bin. Families seem to be engaged by their childrens' efforts to compost.
