1. <u>16448</u>

702 North Midvale Boulevard (Target) - PUD(GDP-SIP) and Signage Package Exceptions. 11th Ald. Dist.

The motion was passed with the following conditions:

- 1. The sidewalk along the Sentry store will be expanded with curb cuts that are aligned with the drive aisles.
- 2. The definition of "family" will be removed from the PUD text.
- 3. Access ramps will be added to all bicycle parking areas.

- 4. That the two freestanding directional signs on Hilldale Way and Frey Street will be changed to blade signs mounted on the building or have an open base as approved by staff.
- 5. That the word "Target" is removed from the "Target parking" clearance signs at all entries to the parking structure except for the one on Hilldale Way, which can say "Target parking".
- 6. The two ground signs near Segoe Road are approved, but are subject to review and change as part of the approval of any future development on that portion of the site.
