 High Speed Rail Station Location - Janet Piraino, Chief of Staff, Mayor's Office; Dave Trowbridge, City of Madison Planning Division

- The Governor wants high speed rail in Wisconsin by 2013.

- Three buildings near Monona Terrace are being considered for the location of the train station: 1 West Wilson, the State of Wisconsin Investment Board, and the DOA building (1 West Wilson would most affect Monona Terrace regarding parking and traffic congestion).

- Officials are very committed to a public process and interested in hearing a variety of viewpoints. Consultants for the project, CH2M Hill, will organize a series of public meetings regarding the train station, and could be invited to attend a future Monona Terrace Board meeting to answer questions and hear concerns of the Board members. The Board is excited about this project, and its potential benefits to Monona Terrace.

- The two biggest challenges are adequate parking and traffic pattern. Other important factors regarding the potential locations for the train station are ridership, cost, and time from Milwaukee to Madison.

|    |              | <ul> <li>The Lake Vista Café opened for the season recently, and is doing well. Staff is hopeful that the weather will be favorable, and looking forward to many guests coming to the Monona Terrace rooftop to enjoy the fine food and outstanding views of Lake Monona. The Tunes concert series provides good business for the Café because attendees purchase food and beverages.</li> <li>Following the recent Earth Day event at Monona Terrace, discussions were held between Monona Terrace staff and University of Wisconsin personnel regarding partnering on a composting project. Monona Catering staff would compost prep food (pre-consumer) scraps at this time. The potential exists to compost as much as one ton per week which would reduce the waste stream considerably, and increase recycling totals. Monona Terrace is accredited as a "green" building, earning LEED-EB status in 2007.</li> <li>First quarter TOT collections were up 3% compared to 2009 totals (\$1,511,372), but less than 2008.</li> </ul> |
