4. 08478 REPORT FROM WATER UTILITY BOARD:

Water sales to commercial users is down 18%; 22% to industrial; and 3% to residential. The Water Utility will not break even (again), an issue for lots of other water utilities as well. Less water usage leads to higher rates, which
