CALL TO ORDER / ROLL CALL

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A motion was made by Taylor, seconded by Slattery, to Approve the July 25, 2011 Minutes. The motion passed by voice vote/other.

5. <u>23465</u> Discussion about public art in historic districts

Sharon Kilfoy briefly explained that as part of the Williamson Street reconstruction project, numerous public art opportunities are present. She described an idea to stamp poetry by local poets in the new concrete sidewalks and other ideas like historic markers and a gateway entry piece. Ms. Kilfoy requested that the Commission provide a recommendation specifically about the poetry in sidewalks. There was discussion about the character of each historic district and how public art must enhance the character of the district to be successful.

A recommendation was made by Gehrig, seconded by Slattery, to support poetry in sidewalks as a way to enhance the Third Lake Historic District. The motion passed by voice vote/other.

6. <u>18755</u> Discussion about applying for a Certified Local Government (CLG) Grant from the State of Wisconsin Historical Society.

Staff provided the Commission with an update that the City is working with the State to write an RFP and select a consultant for the architectural survey near Hoyt Park.

The Landmarks Commission discussed the preservation priority list and confirmed that staff should submit a Letter of Intent to apply for an architectural survey near Eken Park for the next CLG grant cycle.

7. <u>20957</u> Buildings proposed for demolition - 2011

The Landmarks Commission discussed that the building at 1112 Spaight is of historic interest and that the proposed project will come before the Landmarks Commission for a Certificate of Appropriateness at which time the Commission will make a formal decision. The Landmarks Commission respectfully requests that a tour of the building be scheduled so possible structural condition issues may be reviewed. The Landmarks Commission calls the Applicant's attention to the demolition standards in the Landmarks Ordinance.

8. <u>07804</u> Secretary's Report

Levitan commented that he went to the Madison Trust Awards Event and there were numerous awards given to projects that had been through the Landmarks Commission process.

Levitan explained that he had been informed about some preliminary plans to redevelop the 100 block of State Street.

Rosenblum requested that the Secretary provide an update on the James Madison Park landmarks at a afuture meeting.
