This Ordinance was Return to Lead with the Following Recommendation(s)

1. add language to new 38.05(9)(e)2. requesting that the city clerk notify the street use staff commission administrator when the council approves or denies a temporary class B license for a street use event and what the conditions are (if any.)

2. clean-up items needed to the street use ordinance: 10.056(o)(6) - Increase the fire lane width requirement from 16' to 20' (request of fire dept.)

10.056(8)(a), (b), (c) - changes to the maximum limit for certificates of insurance when required for events from \$1 million to "as determined by risk manager."  $\cdot$  make the indemnification requirement for street use applicants apply to all events.
