5. 27918 ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH DIVISION REPORT - 5 minutes

Beth Cleary provided an update for the section. Madison Kipp Corporation (MKC) work continues with extraction of soil to the west of MKC and continuing groundwater monitoring. We have hired our summer Limited Term Employment staff including two mosquito technicians and two pool samples. All Sanitarians have been trained for the minor changes in the food code taking effect September 1. Mobile food carts have increased with warmer weather and two were closed in the last two weeks due to critical violations. We are in the midst of a Quality Improvement (QI) project involving our temporary food program, which issues 2000 permits issued in the county. This includes gathering data and with possible changes for improvement. After the recent appeal by a relative, not the animal owner, of a dog declared dangerous, we are changing the Madison General Ordinance language so that only the animal owner or the victim can appeal. The animal was re-homed in Oconomowoc. There is another dangerous animal appeal pending. The Pesticide Advisory Management Committee was dissolved although an annual report will still be completed and presented to the Board for approval. The public will have an opportunity to comment on the report at that time. A question was asked if there is anyone keeping track of pesticide use residentially or in businesses.

The County Executive made no request for cuts in the budget but rather charged staff to be creative in forming new partnerships or bringing in revenue. A few highlights follow:

- -We have the oldest department in the city and the county which means increased compensated absences
- -GPR support of WIC has decreased dramatically, clients surveyed better than before
- -Immunizations cost per clinic has risen, least used clinics will be consolidated
- -Dirty houses, air quality i.e. environmental complaints are high cost items with no revenue
