A dangerous animal appeal hearing was held earlier today. The appellant withdrew her appeal to have the dog humanely euthanized. Her citations were reduced from five to two.

A resolution to develop an equity impact model was introduced at Common Council August 6 and will be referred to the Board of Health and other committees. We have tagged on to the city employee engagement training to use as a platform on how to work together. The first step is talking about what equity means.

A letter of intent was submitted to the Wisconsin Partnership Fund on behalf of our department with UW Department of Family Medicine as a joint project for planning only. The PHINEX project extracts data from UW medical records, which will help us use data for chronic disease prevention.

Work continues on the Affordable Care Act to get the word out about health insurance marketplace. Statistics show that 70% of uninsured do not know this is an option for them. Our goal is to increase insurance coverage rates in Dane County, especially in vulnerable populations and young adults. Six staff will be trained as certified application counselors to get people enrolled. We are working on targeted and accurate messaging, outreach with the libraries and coordination with key community groups. Information will be available in English, Spanish and Hmong.

10. 27918 ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH DIVISION REPORT - 5 minutes

Beth Cleary report included the following highlights. There is a new fireworks location for Rhythm and Booms next year. The lab is doing nitrate sampling with the DNR. The first human case of West Nile Virus in Dane County was in July. There was another dangerous animal declaration recommending euthanasia, with no appeal. We are in the midst of the licensed establishment renewal season and some places have been closed due to nonpayment of fees. They can reopen if they pay their fee. We are collecting data on a quality improvement project begun several months ago

The message from executives was to prepare the budget with no cut and additionally prepare several alternatives with a 3% cut. A 3% cut in the department budget is \$314,852. As a result of sequestration, we will lose \$150,000 in federal funds. The funding of vacancies is \$351,802. Our submission is to reclassify current vacancies into the following positions; Public Health Planner-Health Policy Analyst, Public Health Planner-Food Security and Poverty Specialist and Public Health Analyst. We also have a request for joint positions with the City Planning Department to include a Public Health/Transportation Planner and Living Streets Project Manager. The timeline for the budget is to present at the Tuesday all staff meeting, submit to finance, with executive consideration in October and to legislative bodies in November for approval. See attachments to the file for further detail. Phair/Lasky moved approval of the budget submittal, passed unanimously.
