A. APPROVAL OF MINUTES - April 23, 2013

A motion was made by Rewey, seconded by De Vos, to Approve the Minutes. The motion passed by voice vote/other.

Perry Sandstrom, a resident of the Dudgeon Monroe Neighborhood, spoke to the Commission to request that they reconsider the Southwest Path lighting plans at a future meeting.

D. ORGANIZATIONAL MEETING

D.1. Introduction of members

Members introduced themselves.

D.2. Election of Chair and Vice-Chair

A motion was made by Rummel, seconded by Steinhofer to table until Crandall arrived. The motion passed. A motion was made by Rummel, seconded by Webber, to take off the table. The motion passed.

Webber nominated Crandall for Chair. No further nominations were made. Webber moved for unanimous approval of Crandall as Chair, seconded by Steinhofer. The motion passed by unanimous consent.

Rewey nominated Webber for Vice-Chair. No further nominations were made. Webber was approved as Vice-Chair by unanimous consent.

D.3. 30181 Pedestrian/Bicycle/Motor Vehicle Commission Rules and Procedures

Rummel asked whether the language related to the term effective dates for alder appointments to PBMVC is accurate. Staff will follow up with the Attorney's Office to review language in the PBMVC Rules and Procedures regarding alder appointment terms to PBMVC, and the date that the appointments become effective.

A motion was made by Rewey, seconded by De Vos, to Approve the rules and procedures, and recommended that the Attorney's office review the language regarding the appointment terms, and when new alder appointments to the Commission are effective. The motion passed by voice vote/other.

A motion was made by Steinhofer, seconded by De Vos, to reconfirm the meeting schedule. The motion passed by voice vote/other.

D.5. Recommending LRTPC appointment to Mayor

Rewey moved to table until after Crandall arrived, seconded by Steinhofer. The motion passed. Rummel moved to take off the table, seconded by Webber. The motion passed.

Webber stated that the LRTPC needs three alder members on the Commission. Currently there are two members with Alders Schmidt and King, so one more alder member is required. There are other commissions that have not yet made their recommendations for appointments to LRTPC, so there may be an alder appointment from another commission. De Vos expressed interest in continuing to serve on the LRTPC. Alder Rummel also expressed interest in continuing to serve on LRTPC. Alder Strasser noted that he would also be willing to serve on the LRTPC. De Vos asked if there were other options for being appointed to the LRTPC other than as a PBMVC representative, such as an alternate position. Crandall will follow-up with the Mayor's Office on behalf of De Vos to determine if there are other options for appointments to LRTPC.
