DISCLOSURES AND RECUSALS

Recusals: Kia Karlen works with Brenda Baker, who has applied for Blink funding. Kia does not stand to gain financially if Brenda receives City funding for her art project, nor does Kia feel that their working relationship would prohibit her from objective judgment of Brenda's proposal.

1. <u>30507</u> Entertainment in Madison

Rachel Lepak - student representative for ALRC presented highlights including: 1) 91% of students believe nighttime entertainment is geared a those 21+ 2) 67% are willing to pay between 15 and 25 dollars for 18+ entertainment 3) 76% are not willing to leave campus for entertainment.

Ms. Lepak proposes the City establish a task force that would work issues related to entertainment. The group would have a representative from the Common Council, mayor's office, student, police, DMI, MAC, and other potential stakeholder groups. The Task Force on Entertainment would look at increasing the amount of local live music including hip hop, movie theaters (especially near campus), bowling allies, and other non-alcohol focused entertainment.

She asked the commission to support the idea of establishing such a task force (submitting a letter of support) and to have a representative from MAC serve on the new body.

A motion was made by Elson, seconded by Schrank, to support exploration of forming a task force that will look at entertainment in Madison with the goal of promoting more diverse entertainment options and venues. Commissioners recommended to Lepak that she present her findings to other relevant commissions and committees as well. They also recommend she present her findings to staff and student leadership at the Memorial Union, and check with the Dean of Students. If such a task force is formed MAC will discuss the opportunity to have a representative serve on that body. Taylor noted that Lepak's research showed that students were not willing to leave campus to seek entertainment and thus didn't fully understand why the task force would look at entertainment City-wide. The motion passed by the following vote:
