Funding for a pilot program to provide assistance to low income neighborhoods and families to obtain internet access. The bulk of the costs to close the "Digital Divide" will go to infrastructure. Other costs may include subsidized payments to commercial providers; cost sharing with other government agencies or social service providers; grant matching funds or in-kind costs; public outreach efforts; or program set up costs.

Amend Board of Estimates Capital Amendment #5 as follows: "Provide funding for the underground of utilities in the 800 and 900 blocks of East Johnson Street. Funding of \$1,000,000 \$750,000 would be provided in each of the years 2015 and 2016 from TID #32 - State Street cash, using the 1/2 mile rule.

The Government East Garage is 55 years old and near the end of its useful life. The current maintenance schedule would keep the facility in operation for approximately 3 more years. The demolition cost estimate for the garage is \$950,000. \$1,500,000 is reauthorized from 2103 2013.

2. <u>31643</u> 2014 Executive Operating Budget

Modify Highlight No. 3 to read: The 2014 Budget includes \$2.6 million for Police Department overtime pay. Of that amount, \$50,000 is earmarked for citywide safety initiatives, \$30,000 for the Southwest Safety initiative, and \$65,000 for peak service times in the Central District. In addition, the Police Chief has the discretion to utilize other budgeted overtime funding for these purposes.

A motion was made by Verveer, seconded by Resnick, to Adopt the Following Amendment: Amendment 1. The motion passed by voice vote/other.

Add funding for the Council Legislative Analyst to attend conferences. In 2013, Alders requested that the Council Legislative Analyst attend the League of Wisconsin Municipalities Conference in Green Bay. Funding was provided from the Council's overall travel fund. There is value in having the Council Legislative Analyst travel to conferences that some Alders, but not most, attend. This amendment provides some basic travel funds for the conferences that the Legislative Analyst is likely to be asked by Alders to attend.

A motion was made by Schmidt, seconded by Resnick, to Adopt the Following Amendment: Amendment 2. The motion passed by voice vote/other.

Add funding to support the activities of the Northside community July 5th event to be held in and around Warner Park to replace Rhythm & Booms in conjunction with the Madison Mallards. A planning process is underway and funding may be necessary to support the community designed events in the first year of activity.

A motion was made by Palm, seconded by Weier, to Adopt the Following Amendment: Amendment 3. The motion failed by voice vote/other.

Direct that unanticipated revenues of up to \$40,000 total to be used first to support additional funding for the Emerging Opportunities Program. Because the budget for General Fund revenues already anticipates \$300,000 in Miscellaneous Revenues, it is the intent of this amendment that any unanticipated revenues of up to \$40,000 over and above the amount already budgeted be first directed to support the Emerging Opportunities Program. In order to recognize any unanticipated revenues and additional expenditure authority during the course of the year, a Resolution(s) to amend the budget as appropriate will require additional Common Council approval.

Provide funding for laundry services for the homeless. The amount provided should allow for about six months of service (January to June, 2014). This is one-time funding intended to bridge the gap until development of sustained service delivery in partnership with other providers.

A motion was made by Schmidt, seconded by Clausius, to Adopt the Following Amendment: Amendment 5. The motion passed by voice vote/other.

Provide funding to support the transportation needs of the homeless to and from shower facilities and related support services. (The funding may be used to augment a similar service provided by the County or other provider). This is one-time funding intended to bridge the gap until development of sustained service delivery in partnership with other providers. Change the amount from \$12,000 to \$10,000.
