There are currently two DRAFT reports (attached) that summarize the data collected in the Warner Parks Fireworks Study, written by Jim Bennett (COE member) and Brynn Bemis, City Engineering. The reports were only just made available to COE members for review, so the intention was to provide these

draft reports in order to get feedback from members, then allow for a more complete discussion at the March COE meeting. Jim and Brynn will discuss how to combine the reports into one for the Common Council.

Committee members were asked to forward any comments to Genesis by March 4.

Public Comment:

Jim Carrier (231 Monterey Dr, Madison) indicated that Wild Warner does not support continuing to release fireworks near the wetland and fishery of Warner Park Lagoons. Results have indicated that there are environmental impacts from the fireworks, public health impacts are unknown, and he asks that the Committee be as proactive as possible when they formulate their recommendations in the report and to ask whether Warner Park is a good site for the event.

Alder Weier noted that the contract for Rhythm and Booms is not yet final, as there are still several points of discussion.

Pat Gadow asked Jim Carrier if he thought the event should be moved entirely. Jim responded that a wetland is not the place for a fireworks display, and a better location might be a ball park, as there would be less environmental impacts. A public waterway should be protected.

Jim Powell (1311 Lake View Ave, Madison) said he first brought his concern about Rhythm and Booms to his alder in 2005. He has found lots of fireworks debris on and around his property. He suggested that the Rhythm and Booms contract be routed to the Committee for review.

Mike Daily indicated that depending on the contract amount, and whether it is already in the budget, the contract may not need approval by the Common Council.

Alder Weier noted that she has indicated her concerns about the event during Rhythm and Booms meetings.
