Update: Progress on Development of City Employee Handbook - Greg Leifer, City Employee & Labor Relations Manger

Greg Leifer (City Employee & Larbor Relations Manger), Jennifer McCulley (Local 60) and Mike O'Brien (Local 236) were present for discussion on this item. Mr. Leifer distributed two handouts and briefly described each handout (handouts attached to legislative file):

1. Employee & Labor Relations Process Outline: Pre-ACT 10 and Post-ACT 10

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2. Development of a Employee Handbook and the creation of an Employee & Labor Relations Committee (ELRC)

Ms. McCulley stated that Local 60 has felt like they have been involved in the Post-ACT 10 process. Mr. O'Brien stated that it has been a very collaborative effort between the city and the unions. Ms. McCulley noted that the new process being developed would discourage individual employees/unions from lobbying the Council directly for changes.

Dan Kennelly, Economic Development Specialist, was present to provide a presentation on the City's Economic Development Strategy. Mr. Kennelly went through the PowerPoint handout and project charter (handouts attached to legislative file) and how the city can develop a strategy to grow the economy and share the prosperity (e.g. real estate, policy, project driven, etc.)

Ald. Shiva Bidar-Sielaff asked if there were conversations on how the Office of Business Resources would collaborate with other departments/divisions in developing this strategy. Aaron Olver stated that they had those conversations and decided to think big and inclusively and invite people into that process (e.g. businesses, UW, etc.) and then have a broader community discussion on their vision for Madison's economy. Then they will see what strategies fall out of those conversations and focus on creating a "to-do list".

Aaron Olver indicated that the Economic Development Strategy would align with the City's Sustainability Plan, Transportation Plan and Comprehensive Plan.

Ald. Matt Phair asked how they would engage the wider community (e.g. neighborhoods). Dan Kennelly stated that they have started having conversations with targeted groups and that through the data analysis piece people would begin to realize that they should be a part of the development of the strategy. Ald. Marsha Rummel commented on the need to create "economic democracy" and that the plan being developed would only be for top 1%.

Ald. Scott Resnick noted that he was hopeful the elements of the plan would identify emerging opportunities and debunk "myths".

Ald. Lisa Subeck noted that photos on the presentation focused on downtown. She asked if they could include photos of other areas in the city.

<u>32927</u> Update: City Placemaking Efforts - Ald. Scott Resnick

Ald. Scott Resnick reminded alders that there is a placemaking grant available in the Mayor's budget (\$25,000) and that they should send him ideas/suggestions for placemaking opportunities in their districts. He has

heard from three alders from the earlier brown bag lunch with the Mayor. Deadline was December 1. CCOC asked Ald. Resnick to send out a reminder to alders
