A. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A motion was made by Rewey, seconded by Rummel, to Approve the Minutes. The motion passed by voice vote/other. De Vos stated that she was not present at the January 28, 2014 meeting and abstained from the vote.

Foster stated that he has reviewed the City of Madison snow removal priority policy, and has met with Chris Kelley in the Streets Division.

Rewey noted that the Platinum report included a recommendation for the City to develop a policy for snow removal on bikeways.

Scott Langer, City Traffic Engineering, stated that the Streets Division will be reporting on the topic of bikeway snow removal at the PBMVC's May meeting.

2013 Annual Traffic Signal Priority List

Registrants: Dan Swift, Columbus Street, Sun Prairie, representing American Family Insurance, registered in support.

Brian Smith of City Traffic Engineering, reported the results of recent studies and staff recommendations to the Commission. The Commission discussed options to improve pedestrian and bike crossing for the intersection of Blount and Williamson Streets. Alder Rummel noted that there are upcoming development proposals in the area which may change traffic patterns in the future. Steinhofer noted that it may be better to wait until changes related to future development are known, rather than spending money to make changes to the intersection that may be unnecessary or inappropriate with upcoming developments.

Smith noted that the intersection of Regent Street and Roby Road does not meet the warrants for the installation of a traffic signal. Lehner asked if there were other options for the intersection such as a pedestrian refuge island. Langer stated that Traffic Engineering can explore the option of installing a pedestrian island, but noted that there may be width constraints. Rewey recommended that staff consider removing parking on the south side of Regent St. to the west of Roby Rd to improve the sight distance at the intersection.

Crandall asked if a bike box could be installed at the intersection of Blair Street and Johnson Street. Rewey noted that motorists turning right on the red light would create problems for pedestrians using the crossing. Langer stated that right turns on red would be prohibited, and there will be a pedestrian-actuated protected crossing. Rewey recommended that staff consider installation of bike boxes at every signalized intersection on Johnson Street from First Street

to Baldwin Street during the reconstruction.

Rummel noted that she wants the intersection of Williamson Street and Blount Street to remain on the list for future consideration for a signal, and does not want the intersection precluded from reconsideration. Langer stated that the Commission is approving the intersections to be signalized in 2014, and that intersections not currently recommended for signalization will remain on the list and can be reconsidered for 2015 or future years.

A motion was made by Rewey, seconded by Rummel, to Approve with the recommendations that staff study the intersection of Blount St. and Williamson St. in one year, that assessment for both the installation and operation of the signal at American Parkway and Buttonwood Drive be included in the agreement between the City and developer, that staff investigate the removal of parking on Regent Street to the west of Roby Road, and that staff examine the construction of bike boxes at all signalized intersections on Johnson Street from First Street to Blount Street during the reconstruction. The motion passed by voice vote/other.
