Fix made the motion to table the discussion to a future meeting. Dailey seconded the motion.

Jim Powell, Midwest Environmental Justice Organization, Lake View Ave.; Jim Carrier, Wild Warner; and Jack Hurst, Yahara Fishing Club registered to speak on this item.

Jim Powell: The fireworks summary provided by Madison Festivals is inadequate. It does not contain information to be able to analyze what the impact is to humans and the environment.

Jim Carrier said the summary doesn't provide adequate information. Said that the work that's been done in Warner Park, such as the addition of the cunnette and replanting the shooting island since Rhythm & Booms stopped are positive steps to protecting the environment.

Jack Hurst, Yahara Fishing Club, Randy Lane, said not having Rhythm & Booms at Warner Park is helping to protect Madison's lakes and the Yahara watershed. Having a fireworks display over Monona Lake had an impact because not all fireworks debris can be cleaned up.

COE members said the fireworks summary was bare bones and that more substance was needed. If the City is going to go forward with more requirements for fireworks displays, such as what information an event summary is required to contain, then the right questions need to be identified.
