-The two current supervisory positions that are open close recruitment on August 21. Hiring is somewhat delayed.

-The Women, Infants and Children (WIC) program is transitioning to E WIC, which uses a card for clients instead of paper checks.

10.c 27918 ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH DIVISION - 5 minutes

-Ebola is no longer considered an outbreak in Liberia.

-We are completing a mass fatality plan, as the coordinating agency, with the Red Cross and the Medical Examiner's office.

-We are now enrolled in the retail food program standards program. Once completed this will help us with accreditation.

-The 50 unit mobile home septic system failure, reported on last month, is still getting pumped, and awaits review by the state.

-Animal Services has been very busy; one dangerous animal was ordered euthanized, and the owner did not appeal. Two owners have appealed determinations; one Administrative Hearing is scheduled and another will be soon.

-Madison Kipp Corporation clean up continues; PCB contamination was found along the neighboring bike path and Goodman splash pad. The company put in a well neutralizer did not work resulting in purple water. The DNR is investigating.
