6. DISCUSS WPCRC FACILITY STUDY AND VISIONING REPORT

A. WPCRC Facility Study and Visioning

• Full scale visioning and facility process began and was staff led not a third party firm to cut costs.

- April 29th for the first meeting
- Karl Van Lith training (facilitator) so not driven by parks
- It was a grass roots effort through social media and hard media

• Tom and Jacob Tisue were there for resources only.

• PowerPoint presentation overviewed the center and park stats to show that a lot going on at the park and there is not a lot a room for growth. People broke into 11 tables for small discussion points, brainstorming ideas and it was open to good or bad, extreme or not.

• Common themes were then listed and discuss. Then stickers were used to mark the most important to them as a group and as individuals.

• It lasted 2 hours and Jacob Tisue felt good variety of people and very diverse from young to old.

• Janet Dyer and Jim Krueger felt it was a good variety of view points, it was educational, a good process and respectful. Alder Rebecca Kemble also please with the results because it could have gone bad.

• David Carpenter asked where do were stand on this visioning. All sheets were typed up in the words of the people, looked for common themes see attachment on agenda.

• The next step is to pull out of the visioning what could and possibly be done. Jacob Tisue talked to Alder Larry Palm and he felt there should be smaller meetings on the subtopics pulled out by parks.

• David Carpenter asked will it come to the Warner Park Community Recreation Center Advisory Subcommittee for decisions and who's in charge of decisions? Jacob Tisue was not sure in what form and who's in charge is upper management of City of Madison Parks with Alder Larry Palm and Rebecca Kemble. Alder Rebecca Kemble and Superintendent Eric Knepp met regarding visioning and the expansion of the building which could happen as soon as the 2016 budget is submitted but must be proposed by end of summer 2015.

• Kay Rutledge would be the supervisor of planning for building expansions.

• Jacob Tisue suggested that we us the \$20,000 extra from the budget to hire a design firm to process the design element of the expansion of Warner Park Community Recreation Center; also use the money to analyze the beach and splash pad planning. Rebecca Kemble feels it should be a consulting firm not a design firm and could be done in house. Jacob explained that we love having the kids here but just don't have the space to accommodate them all we need to expand.
