5A 42094 Discussion on Housing Choice Voucher Program funding for 2016

Tom provided the following update:

120 families were added to the Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) Program in 2015. In January 2016 based on the number of vouchers in use, the average assistance being paid out and the incrcrease in rents the CDA made the decision to stop issuing vouchers. Tom explained that while projected expenses for 2016 exceeds the authorized budget authority the CDA planned to spend reserves to ensure all obligations were met and utilization is kept as high as possible. In a phone call with HUD yesterday, he spoke with the Shortfall Prevention Team who advised that they would like to see a resolution from the Board acknowledging the Board has been briefed on this issue. He intends to come back to the Board with a resolution next month.

Dean stated that there is no action required on this point but we will look for a resolution next month.
