**D.1.** Repeal and recreate Section 12.325 of the Madison General Ordinances to limit persons entering or staying on highways.

Foster moved to place the item on file. The motion failed by the following vote: (AYES - 2 - Foster; Crandall NOES - 3 - Zellers; Kemble; Skidmore)

Kemble made a motion to refer the item to the next meeting, in order for an ordinance sponsor to be in attendance to explain and answer questions, as outlined in the Racial Equity and Social Justice Initiative Tool. Foster seconded. The motion passed by voice vote/other. (Kolar and Lehner did not vote.)

#### E. REPORTS

E.1. 43455

Comments on potential pedestrian and bicycle projects the City should consider undertaking in the 2017-2019 Capital Budgets to increase opportunities for walking and bicycling in Madison.

Zellers suggested to divide public comments and input by Alder district and share the information with the Alders. Lehner agreed. Foster expresssed the desire for more durable, organized, and actionable data. Foster suggested turning this information into more of a prioritized living document that is accessible to the public. Zellers agreed. Kemble agreed better more organized date is needed. Kemble suggested aquiring an intern or LTE to organize this data and create a robust database that is publically accessible. Staff agreed it would be helpful. Kemble suggested the three Alders sponsor a budget amendment in order to procure an intern or LTE. Zellers agreed. Crandall suggested tying this report to neighborhood plans. Chair, Rewey, wanted to consult with staff on the issues raised, and then bring this item back at a future meeting.

E.2. 44541 State Street Ped Counter - Staff Report

Staff gave an update on pedestrian counters on State Street, noting Alder Verveer is interested in purchasing more, in order to encourage growth and support businesses.

E.3. 44560 Cottage Grove RD Resurfacing and Ped/Bike Facilities Improvement Project

Staff discussed the location opportunities to place bike lanes on existing streets. The body, as whole, felt the pavement markings were successful and an improvement.
