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Woulf provided an update on the U.S. Conference of Mayors Food Policy Task Force meeting that he attended in Washington D.C. The task force welcomed Mayor Muriel Bowser as the new co-chair. He also announced that Public Health, Parks, REAP and MMSD are working together on a potential summer meal site(s).

Woulf additionally provided an update on the Oscar Mayer site. He stated that the City has no control over the site and it can be sold to anyone Kraft Heinz decides. However, staff is working on a document that makes it clear that the city's goals and priorities for the site are for it to stay as employment center and in the food manufacturing to the degree possible. A neighborhood listening session is being scheduled for late February.
