NEW BUSINESS

3 [17817](#) Review of various transportation projects in current (and potential future) Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for the Dane county area

Chris Petykowski (City Engineering) provide an overview of the many roadway and bicycle facility projects being planned and implemented over the next several years. He noted that the planned projects have not changed much over the past year since the City's capital budget is highly constrained. PBMVC and LRTPC members asked questions and offered comments on the various projects.

Rob Phillips (City Engineer) pointed out that the City does its very best to accommodate all modes of transportation when it designs roadway facilities, including bicycle and pedestrian improvements.

Phillips indicated that the City has been very interested in building bicycle paths within the railroad corridors, as a high quality addition to the system. However, he indicated that the private railroad operator has been very reluctant to agree to this.

Petykowski also described the City Engineering Division's goals for keeping the various roadways in the City in good condition - which differ slightly for arterials, collectors and local streets. In general, pavement conditions have been improving over the past 15 years or so, although keeping roadway

conditions is good shape has become more challenging due to budget constraints in recent years.
