- Concerned that if there is only one road, it will have a high volume of traffic.
- Proposed changes to Braxton Place make it too wide.
- Bayview should remain connected to the rest of the Triangle.
- Some members still feel uncomfortable about adding a street through the Triangle, and prefer an improved Braxton Place only.
- Goal should be to minimize the amount of land used for streets. Show an option with an improved Braxton Place only, possibly with some other limited vehicle access points.
- Some members indicated a desire for improving east-west pedestrian access from Bay side area to Triangle.
- Johnson moved to adjourn and Pelski seconded the motion.
