BUSINESS BY MEMBERS

The UDC Secretary shared information on small cell design guidelines. She has been working with people from Public Works, Engineering, IT to talk about design guidelines and how this affects our urban design districts, historic district and the city as a whole. Small cell facilities are the possible future of 5G, in more locations with smaller equipment. We need to regulate how it works in the public right-of-way, make sure the locations are consistent and asthetic. Unfortunately our hands are rather tied due to legislation, but we can create guidelines for things like how high off the ground and how often. She shared photos of what these could look like on light poles and utility poles. Federal law requires the City to open up its infrastructure and was enacted into law on July 10, 2019. Engineering has created a permit so they can be reviewed to be sure they follow these design guidelines. Our current poles aren't strong enough to hold a lot of this equipment, so the applicant will be required to pay for a new pole. There are health concerns because there

hasn't been a lot of research on this.
