A motion was made by Green, seconded by Shields, to Return to Lead with the Recommendation for Approval to the PLAN COMMISSION. The motion passed by voice vote/other.

Presentation by Planning Staff (PS), Jeff Greger. Discussion by members. Green asked about setbacks and the effect on the terrace. PS stated the terrace would remain or be enhanced. Ryan asked about the current demographic of the residents. PS stated the goal was to have a mix of affordable housing options. Green asked about implementation. PS stated that it would be an Urban Design District with these guidelines. Ryan asked about building codes. LeZaks stated that the City cannot go beyond state adopted code. PS stated that the stormwater ordinances were being updated. Ryan asked about park space cost. PS stated that it would include acquisition and construction costs and that parks has funding for this. LeClair asked about the public art process and participating stakeholders. PS shared the process to include underrepresented populations. LeZaks asked about transportation connectivity. PS noted the proximity to bus as well as guidelines for EV charging stations and B-Cycle stations. Ryan asked about density. PS referred to the Comprehensive Plan and zoning which guides density. Reece read statement from member Jon Hepner sent via email which addressed his concerns on the proposed setbacks, front porch or balcony requirements, Permeable pavers, step back above 4 floors, Question on why not taller buildings, and conflict with affordable housing or solar installations. Vickerman shared the role that Shared Solar could play in multi-family developments.
