		The EOC will continue to focus on housing within the City of Madison for 2019. They will continue to work on creating action items to assist residents, while also turning an eye to how transportation and the availability of transportation are linked to housing choices and stability.

		McDowell informs the commission they do not have the authority to establish a committee. It was discussed that since the Housing Strategy Committee has been revived and establishing quorum, there is not as much of a need for a new committee. Alder Moreland is on the Housing Strategy Committee as well, which will help the EOC stay informed about what is being discussed and plans of action. The EOC would like to see joint meetings between the two bodies on a regular basis to stay connected in their shared priorities.
