Members reviewed the attached draft. Discussed issues identified below:

- 1. The use of a Sensitive Surveillance Technology Oversight Board. (#7) Board would be subject to open records law would they need to always be in closed session due to confidential information being reviewed?
- 2. Cataloguing Requests / Shared Records (inter-agency)
 Is there an audit trail of who accesses what? Currently can see who logged in, what camera, and who logged out but not what.
- 3. Progressive discipline of employees / Compliance with surveillance policy Discipline would be dependent upon violation.

 CIO will do review and reach out to departments if they are out of compliance (rewrite: IV. The Chief Tech Officer shall direct any City department out of compliance with the ordinance to cease use of surveillance tech and delete V. A person who is surveilled and injured by a violation of the ordinance my institute proceedings against the City)
- 4. Revisiting the exceptions for the emergency purchases of surplus military equipment

Want to ensure that these are not impulse purchases (federal property disposition programs), require an approval process before using if already purchased.

- 5. Annual report
- 7. (g) Total annual costs, including personnel delete "personnel" and add equipment and software (maintenance is a separate issue)
- 6. Definition

APM and Ordinance will use same language

DATA MANAGEMENT POLICIES
