Phil Gaebler gave a summary presentation of the efforts City Engineering has undertaken in fulfillment of their Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) Storm Water Management Program (SWMP). Measures include: public education and outreach, public involvement and participation, illicit discharge detection and elimination, construction site pollutant control, post-construction storm water management, pollution prevention, and storm sewer system mapping.

COE membered showed particular interest in aiding with public education and outreach with their networks, helping expand the storm drain mural project (https://ripple-effects.com/Storm-Drain-Murals), and increasing the number of rain gardens in the City.

A motion was made by Leeper, seconded by Lasky, to Return to Lead with the Recommendation for Approval to the BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS. The motion passed by the following vote:

Members determined that focusing on reducing water softener usage. Discussed optimizing water softener settings, putting units on timers, replumbing so not all water needs to be softened, and rebates for upgrading to more efficient softeners. Discussed non-salt softening technologies, but those do not currently meet US requirements. Members would like to discuss with a plumber to understand standard plumbing practices with softeners in new construction. Would also like to find out what City of Madison facilities softener salt usage is and how new buildings plumbing is designed. It was also recommended that City facilities should track their softener salt usage, if they don't already.
