### **DISCUSSION WITH THE MAYOR**

The Mayor updated CCEC members on the following:

Transportation funding - the city received the federal bus facility grant that they applied for (\$7 million with city's \$5 million match). The city is looking at the former Oscar Mayer site because of the available electrical service (for future electric buses) and moving in jobs to the neighborhood.

Climate Resilience - the city is partnering with the Nelson Institute and UW Extension on internal resilience planning and being prepared for climate change impacts - several months process, not planning a report but rather have city departments integrate the results into their work plans. Will provide updates to the Sustainable Madison Committee (Deputy Mayor Baumel is point person on this project).

PFAS - most people's exposure to PFAS does not come from water but from other sources in the environment, mainly consumer goods (80% eg: nonstick cookware, raincoats, etc.). Main focus is to reduce PFAS in our consumer goods (e.g. purchasing). Notification has begun about PFAS in Starkweather Creek (notice to residents, neighborhood associations, posting in newspapers, signage along creek, etc.)
