 62481 Presentations and Discussion: NAMI Dane County, Wisconsin State Public Defender's Office, and Dane County District Attorney's Office

Anna Moffit, Executive Director of NAMI Dane County, presented on the topic of body-worn cameras from the perspective of her organization, and emphasized the need for clear policies on when the body-worn cameras are used, privacy for individuals experiencing a mental health crisis, and transparency about how video is used. The committee then engaged in a question and answer period.

Kelli Thompson and Adam Plotkin from the Wisconsin State Public Defender's Office presented about the effects of body-worn cameras on public defenders' workload and ability to defend their clients. They highlighted the need for retention of very large data files. District Attorney Ismael Ozanne also presented. The committee then engaged in discussion.

Captain Austin provided the committee with MPD Accountability Reports, which present data about internal officer complaints.
